The Knock-Out Stages and Streaming

The Government's decision to play all Gaelic Games behind closed doors until September 13th is dis-appointing for all club members and other supporters. Ironically, CLG Dhún na nGall scheduled knock-out games for September because the original government roadmap designated the start of that month for the return of up to 5,000 supporters at our games. As Iron Mike said "everyone has a plan until they get punched in the face".

The GAA is a widespread grassroots organisation and it is important in these difficult times that CLG Dhún na nGall do their utmost to look after the interests of the members and supporters who make clubs throughout the County the excellent community organisations they are. As such, the County Board is striving to broadcast most of the 33 knockout games in the Michael Murphy Sports & Leisure Senior, Intermediate and Junior championships – football and hurling. Kudos to Aodh Ruadh and Setanta who stepped up to the mark last weekend to stream the Junior Hurling semi-finals on their own Facebook pages. This weekend CLG Dhún na nGall intend to stream four Senior and four Intermediate Championship quarterfinals and three Relegation play-off games as follows:

All of these games are available on a PPV basis - €3 per game - via the Donegal GAA website. It is planned to stream subsequent games over the rest of September although the latter end of the current schedule may be subject to change, moving forward or backwards, depending on future circumstances. While many clubs have been happily streaming over the last six weeks, Donegal GAA streamed its first 2020 game on August 23rd - the Round 4 football game between St Eunans and St Michaels. The live stream attracted peak-viewing of over a 1,000 and within a few days had been viewed over 15,000 times on the Official Donegal Facebook page.

The knock-out games streamed by the County Board will be on a PPV basis. The quarterfinals will cost €3 and other games €5 except for the Senior football final which will be €8. The PRO will produce a series of "virtual programmes" - such as this one - that can be can be consulted on-line or down loaded/printed. Programmes will be included in the PPV price or free where there is no PPV as is the case with this Virtual Programme. While the County Board will endeavour to stream all knockout games where this is not possible it is hoped other games can be streamed with the help of clubs.

At this point, it is appropriate to express my gratitude to the many clubs that have streamed games (for free) and looked after the interests of their supporters locally, elsewhere in Ireland and overseas over recent weeks. The County Board will forego revenue on games where clubs are providing the voluntary help and will stream these games for free. For all streamed games, and the "free" ones in particular, it is worth noting that streaming in the County is still in its infancy, there may be occasional issues with consistent coverage in some venues and it is being provided by local, unpaid volunteers - people should manage their expectation around this. Finally thank you to the commentators - as above - and the four stream teams - described elsewhere in this programme who have made this venture possible.

Some room for upset in Senior Quarterfinals but Home Teams are Favourites

The Senior Championship was run in a novel sixteen team league format this year. Nevertheless the outcome was much the same as last year with the four 2019 semi-finalists, dubbed the "top four" by many, easing to the top of the table. As a result they all avoid each other in the quarterfinals and each have strenghtened their chances of progress by securing home advantage. Gaoth Dobhair and Naomh Conaill both cruised through their four league mathces with a 100% record while the only points dropped by Kilcar and St Eunans were against each other.

All is not hopeless for Realt an Mara, Naomh Micheál, Glenfin and Sean MacCumhaill, however. The Ballybofey side ran Gaoth Dobhair relatively close in Machaire Gathlán last weekend and will hope the experience will push their squad that little bit harder this Sunday. St Michael's faded badly against St Eunans in O'Donnell Park in their final game but if they welcome back Michael Langan and the evergreen Colm Anthony is back in harness they cannot be rulled out. Glenfin ran the eventual champions close for long perids at the quarterfinal stages last year but the suspicion is that Naomh Conaill have moved on even from last year's stellar campaign, that only ended in the Uster final. Also last year Realt na Mara put Gaoth Dobhair to the pin of their collar in Sunday's venue, O'Donnell Park. St Eunans have already comfortably accounted for the Bundoran side in Round 1 of the League though and will be confident of doing so again. The upshot is that an upset cannot be ruled out and while it could jhappen in any of the four games it would still be a major surprise.

AFTER a hectic period of action, the quarter finals of the Michael Murphy Sports and Leisure Senior Championship take centre stage this weekend.

On paper, all four home teams will be expected to progress to the semi-finals – in keeping with the rankings.

Indeed, with talented youngsters breaking through into the senior ranks in the next year or two, St Eunan's, Naomh Conaill, Gaoth Dobhair and Kilcar will remain among the favourites to land the Dr Maguire Cup going forward.

MacCumhaills will be hoping that exciting young attacker Oisin Gallen and Donegal U20 colleague Luke Gavigan can help propel them into that top bracket while Michael Langan and Colin McFadden form part of the new brigade driving St Michael's forward.

The McEniff brothers, Michael and Cian, and



Timmy Govorov have stepped up to the plate for Bundoran alongside county players Jamie and Paul Brennan while the McGlynns, Aaron and Odhran, have impressed for a Glenfin team which continues to have talisman Frank McGlynn behind the wheel.

Football isn't played on paper – a lesson which some players and supporters have found out the hard way over the years – but I still feel that the 'big 4' will have too much this weekend.

Winning is a habit, a good one. It's also a culture that has been nurtured and developed within the most successful clubs in the county.

With that in mind I would expect Gaoth Dobhair, who landed the Donegal and Ulster Championship crowns in 2018, reigning champions Naomh Conaill, St Eunan's and Kilcar to make up the semi final line-up come Sunday evening.

Covid-19 Adjustments to Match Regulations

Restrictions due to Covid-19 required a number of adjustments to Match Regulations for Gaelic Games during 2020. These include:

- **1.3** A maximum of 20 players (starting 15 and 5 panel members) shall be allowed within the pitch enclosure during the playing of the game. Any additional panel members should be outside the pitch enclosure.
- **1.4** A maximum of 4 (football) & 5 (hurling) Team Officials shall be allowed within the pitch Enclosure during the playing of our games one Bainisteoir, one Maor Foirne, one Medic, One Club Official and One Maor Camán (Hurling only).
- **1.5** Each team will be allocated an area of the pitch (the Team Officials & Players Zone) between the 20 m and 45m lines in advance of the game by the Committee-in-Charge. Their team officials and panel of players, as per regulations 1.3 & 1.4, shall be positioned during the game. The Zones shall have ten seats positioned to ensure compliance with Government social distancing guidelines (currently 2 metres). Dugouts may be used provided the government guidelines around social distancing are observed.
- **1.7** Ball boys are not permitted.
- **1.8** Accredited photographers with media passes will be permitted pitch-side. They are restricted to the opposite side of the pitch to the Team Officials and they are not allowed behind either set of goalposts.
- 2.8 Water Breaks One water break will take place between the 15th & 20th minute in each half. The referee will signal for the water break only when the ball has gone out of play following a score, wide or during a stoppage called by the Referee. The breaks should last no longer than a minute, with players coming to the area in front of their team zone and drinking from their own clearly marked bottle. The time taken for the break will be added to the end of each half as part of the additional time. If a venue has a match clock, it should continue during this time. Players are permitted to position their clearly marked water bottle around the outside of the pitch. Maor Uisce are not permitted in either Football or Hurling.
- **2.10 Substitutes** Substitutes are not allowed a kick/puck around at half-time. A maximum of three substitutes wearing designated distinctive tops may warm up on sidelines at any one time. A maximum number of 5 substitutes are allowed within the pitch enclosure at any one time. As per rule, there is no limit on the size of a club match day panel.
- 5.1 The following guidelines are issued to Players & Team Officials to reduce risk and maximise personal safety: no handshakes before or after games; no spitting or nose-clearing; team huddles should only take place where social distancing is observed; use hand-sanitisers before and after every match; players should use their own clearly marked water bottles; interaction with opponents & match officials should be kept to a minimum after the match.
- **5.2** Players & team officials are reminded of the following disciplinary rules during the Covid-19 Emergency. **Note:** All suspensions below are the minimum and can be increased by the relevant committee.

Player

- Spitting at an opponent, team mate or match official is dealt with in Rule 5.20 (Hurling) and Rule 5.18 (Football) Red Card; Cat III; one-match ban
- Deliberately coughing in the face of an opponent may be considered "behaving in a way which is dangerous to an opponent" (5.17 H; 5.19 F) Red Card; Cat III; one-match ban
- Challenge the authority of the Referee, Umpire, Linesman or Sideline Official (6.1 H & F) Yellow Card
- Remonstrate in an aggressive manner with a Match Official (5.13 F) Black Card (football)
- Threatening or abusive conduct to a Match Official (5.39 H; 5.35 F) Red Card; Cat V; 12 weeks

Team Official

- Any type of physical interference with an Opposing Player or Team Official Cat II a; 8 weeks Suspension
- Abusive language to Match Official Cat I a; 4 weeks Suspension
- Threatening or abusive conduct to Match Official Cat III a; 12 weeks Suspension
- Assault on Match Official Cat IV a; 48 weeks Suspension
- The **Referee** has authority during the game to send any person in breach of Match Regulations to the stand/outside the pitch enclosure and such person cannot be replaced.
- **5.3** Club Photographers are not permitted inside enclosed pitch area, Club Photographers name must be supplied in advance by participating Club and imagery is for Club use only.
- **5.4** The County Management Committee may on two occasions only amend regulations during the pandemic
- **5.5** The County Management Committee may retire a team at any stage of the competition due to the COVID 19 Pandemic (The County Management may replace a retired team in conjunction with rule 6.21 T.O. 2019
- **5.6** Home Venues may be reviewed after the group stages

Two Cracking Senior Championship Relegation Semi-finals in Prospect

The fight to avoid the relegation places in the Michael Murphy Sports and Leisure Senior Championship went down to the final day of the competition with eight teams in danger of landing in the bottom four places. Wins for St Nauls and Killybegs hauled them both clear of the Relegation play-offs. Glenswilly had a narrow escape as Baile na nGalloglach drew with Na Ceithre Maistír to push the Donegal town side clear and leave the Milford side on just one league point -an extra point on the pitch to give them victory would have put them ahead of Glenswilly on points difference.

With a negative points difference of only 16 points Dungloe lost their first three games narrowly but a powerful second half performance from Killybegs in their final game condemned them to the play-offs. Neither Ardara nor Termon were treated kindly by the draw. Ard an Rátha put in credible performances against three quarterfinalists - with narrow losses to Sean MacCumhaills and St Michaels and getting closer to Naomh Conaill than any other team. However, they never got started against Realt na Mara, not helped by a star performance by Realt keeper Ashley Mulhearn. A young Termon side were unfortunate to meer both Kilcar and Naomh Conaill and stumbled against Naomh Naille in their final game - they were, however, short of a couple of their more experienced forwards in that game.

With the final placings throwing up regional rivals in both semi-finals parish pride combined with the fight for Senior Championship final should guarantee two cracking matches.
