

VERY REMEMBERED

On the occasion of their 150th Anniversary, Royal National Lifeboat Institute Ireland thank the Gaelic Athletic Association and the teams for this venture in support of the Irish lifeboat service. It is greatly appreciated.

However, this is not the first formal association between the two bodies. In 1914, James Wickham and William Duggan, crewmen of the Rosslare lifeboat—and both members of the GAA—volunteered to man a dinghy to rescue some of the Norwegian crew of the schooner 'Mexico', who had been clinging to the Keeragh rocks for two days. The dinghy was pierced by a rock on the way out, but Wickham stuffed the hole with a loaf of bread wrapped in an oilskin. For this action they were both awarded the Gold Medal of the Gaelic Athletic Association—the only occasion on which this award has been made outside the field of sport.

It is also very appropriate that the proceeds of this charitable event should be shared between RNLI and the fund which has been started to help the dependants of the recent disaster off the Donegal coast.

As spectators leave the ground, a shared collection will be taken in aid of both charities and it is hoped that there will be a generous response.
