It is 58 years since the Senior Championship has been won by Donegal Town. The recent progress of the Four Masters club has brought joy to all our hearts. How good it is to see two adults teams from Donegal Town field every Sunday. The fact that the small parish of Cill Charthaigh fields three adult teams every Sunday is a tremendous tribute to everyone involved in the club. This is their second senior final in three years. It has all the ingredients for a classic.

We are grateful for the good times that Cumann Lúthchleas Gael in Donegal is enjoying. It has been a fine Senior Championship. Seventeen games, in eleven of which three points or less separated the teams. St. Eunan's, Bundoran and Na Dúnaitb, among others, count themselves unlucky not to be gracing to-day's big occasion. Eleven of the players on view today will play for Donegal in the Ulster Under-21 final in the near future. That should be the next big day-out for all of us.

DOWN THE YEARS

1922 . . . The 1922 County final was played in Ballybofey on June 4 with County Secretary Johnny Curran refereeing. Castlefinn beat Glenties by three points. No more than that could I glean from the local papers in those pre-'Tíme Si' days! Glenties had beaten Bundoran in the semi-final and Castlefinn had disposed of Kincasslagh.

1932 . . . Ballyshannon won their second title on 14 August 1932 when they beat Dungloe by 1—7 to 0—1 in Ballybofey. E. McFeely refereed. The Aodh Rua fifteen was: P. Rooney; J. Cleary, J. McDermott, F. Little; D. Kane, M. Watkins, T. Gallagher; T. McDermott, J. Gallenagh; P. McGonagle, R. Dolaney, G. Campbell; A. O'Gorman, J. Leydon, A. Sweeney.

1942 . . . It was Ballyshannon's turn again in 1942. They beat Glenties in Ardara on 13 September. P. J. McGill was the referee. The score was 2—8 to 1—4. The new Ballyshannon side was: H. McGuinness; P. O'Neill, M. Melly, L. Slevin; J. McGarrigle, D. Doherty, S. Slevin; L. McGettigan, B. Gallagher; M. Slevin, P. J. Goane, J. Gallagher; S. Slevin, S. Kane, J. McDermott.

1952 . . . 1952 was Killybegs' year. On September 14 the Dr. Maguire Cup went to the South-West when Killybegs beat St. Eunan's by 0—9 to 1—5 in Donegal Town. P. Laffey refereed. How many Killybegs men on this team? N. J. Duggan; J. McHugh, F. O'Donnell, H. O'Donnell; T. McHugh, P. McShane, F. Gillespie; E. Cunningham, E. McBrearty; D. Hartnett, T. Wickham, W. Cunningham; H. Phillips, S. McGettrick, A. Carr. Frank O'Donnell, Wickham and McGettrick were on Donegal's winning Lagan Cup team in March 1952. O'Donnell was also on the Ulster Junior Football Championship-winning side of '52.

1962 . . . Séan Mac Cumhaill's began their three-in-a-row in 1962. On September 2 in O'Donnell Park, Letterkenny, they beat Gweedore 1—9 to 1—7. John Faul refereed. The MacCumhaill's team: J. Leeper; M. Laverty, J. D. McMenamin, B. Laverty; P. Finnerty, J. Fleming, B. McFeely; L. Doherty and F. McFeely; D. McCool, A. Gallen, H. Laverty; T. McMenamin, J. Reilly, T. Sweeney. Subs., S. Given, M. Doherty. One press report called it 'one of the greatest ever Senior County Football finals'.

1972 . . . St. Eunan's last County Senior title was won in Ballybofey on September 17 1972 with a certain D. Kelly (Castlefinn) refereeing! St. Eunan's beat Clanna Gael by 2—12 to 1—8. St. Eunan's line-out: C. Gallagher; B. McFeely, J. Hannigan, P. Gallagher; P. Conaghan, S. Durcan, A. Delap; J. Gallagher, A. Gallagher; L. Byrne, P. McGowan, M. Crossan; J. Winston, M. Sweeney, D. O'Leary. Subs., S. Ferriter, P. Hughes, T. Kelly. A. Gallagher, M. Sweeney and J. Winston were, of course, on Donegal's Ulster S.F.C.-winning team of 1972 with J. Hannigan a sub.

1982 . . . ?

CILL CHARTHAIGH

John Hegarty: Aged 22. Goalkeeper. John spent his younger days in America. Unfortunate to miss the 1980 final. One of five ex-Falcarragh Community Schoolmen on the Kilar panel. Works in Killybegs fish factory.

Dinny McBrearty: Aged 27. Corner back. Holder of three County Under-21 medals and a regular member of the Kilar team since 1972. Played for County at Under-21 level. Boatyard worker.

Danny Gillaspie: Aged 30. Full back. Played at midfield in the 1980 final. Has played for County seniors. Brother of County Chairman. Teacher in Carrick Vocational School.

John Quinn: Aged 32. Corner back. Back again after a lay-off due to back injury. Ex-county player. Bainteoir i Íathach Geilteach.

Maurice Carr: Aged 21. Half back. Played in goals in the 1980 final. Scored for Kilar Under-21 team this year. Brother of John. Labourer.

John Carr: Aged 26. Half back. Broke a bone in his hand in the League game agaisnt Aodh Ruadh on August 1. Had enjoyed a great season until then. Designer in Kilar factory.

Michael Carr: Aged 27. Half-back. Team captain. The only Kilar man to play on a winning Donegal team in the Ulster S.F.C. final — top of the left's in 1974. Colleagues star with Falcarragh. Carrick county man. Shopkeeper.

Seán McGlinley: Aged 35. Half-forward. But played at half-back in semi-final. One of Donegal's great-hearted, long-serving players. Captained the 1980 side. Lorry driver.

Aodh Connor: Aged 28. Midfielder. And one of the main reasons why Kilar are in the final. Great displays in Letterkenny and against Downing. Has played for Donegal. Civil Servant in Sligo.

Nelly Byrne: Aged 27. Midfielder. In his first full season with Kilar following his transfer from Naomh Conaill. The tall bearded Nelly has played for Donegal. Board na Mona employee.

Martin McHugh: Aged 21. Half-forward. Donegal's most outstanding young footballer. Led National scoring averages for most of this year. Scored 0-10 in 1980 final. Key member of Donegal U-21 team. Factory worker.

Tommy McFadden: Aged 25. Half-forward. Although Tommy is really a play-anywhere man. Career plagued with injuries. Otherwise would have been a

regular County player. With the black beard. Factory worker.

Francie Gallagher: Aged 23. Half-forward or corner-forward. Like most of this Kilar panel has won League, Shield and Championship medals since 1979. Carpenter. Boatyard worker.

James McHugh: Aged 18. Corner forward. Or corner back. A brother of Martin's. County minor this year — scored the two goals in Ulster M.F.L. final. And the goal in Letterkenny. And two goals in the play-off. And the Minor Championship goal against Armagh. Boatyard worker.

Slamus McBrearty: Aged 25. Half-forward. Better known as 'Super'. Promoted from Kilar's second team for whom he starred in their promotion-winning Division 3 campaign. Fisherman.

Charlie Byrne: Aged 25. Corner forward. Cuts in from the left. Missed the 1979-80-81 campaigns due to Roman studies. Chaplain to Donegal Vocational School.

Charlie McGreany: Aged 21. Half-back. Tough uncompromising player. Had good U-21 campaign with Kilar this year. Missed Downings semi-final. Fisherman.

John Doogan: Aged 20. Half-back. John has unfortunately missed the whole League-Championship campaign due to a serious injury. P. & T. employee.

Christy Gillespie: Aged 20. Half-forward. On-and-off first team. Playing well for Erin's Hope in Dublin. Student-teacher in St. Patrick's, Drumcondra.

Vernon Hegarty: Aged 19. Half-forward. On-and-off first team. Brother of goalkeeper John. Ex-Falcarragh player. Factory worker.

Michael Doherty: Aged 26. Half-forward. Not able to command a first-team place this year. E.S.B. employee.

Michael McFadden: Aged 22. Brother of Tommy. Like Tommy has had an injury-ridden career. Works in fish factory in Killybegs.

Peter Conroy: Aged 27. Played in 1980 final but is a second-team player most of the time this season. Plays anywhere. Factory worker.

Francie Cannon: Aged 26. Half-forward. Brother of Aodh's. Not a regular first team man this year. Only Dublin-based panelist. Works with Fine Brigada.

IAN HEGARTY: Over 30. Team manager. Played in 1980 final. One of the most respected mentors in Donegal football. Manager of the successful 1980 side and of Kilar since then. Factory worker.

CILL CHARthaIGH – STAIR

This is Cill Charthaigh's fifth appearance in the County Senior Football Championship final. They were champions in 1925 and 1960; runners-up in 1959 and 1963.

1925 — In the South and South-West League of 1924/25 Ballyshannon and Ardara finished on top with Kilcar third and so out of the running. Ballyshannon and Ardara had to play-off and the match was fixed for Kilcar. Ballyshannon and Ardara agreed to play it in Mountcharles. Ballyshannon won, thus qualifying to meet Dunfanaghy in the County final. Kilcar, however, protested on the grounds that Ballyshannon and Ardara were automatically disqualified owing to their not playing at the proper venue. The Kilcar protest was successful and they were to play Dunfanaghy in the County final in Letterkenny on July 28, 1925. Dunfanaghy failed to turn up and Kilcar were awarded the Championship. The Kilcar line-out was: Jim Toland; Johnny McGinley, Frank McGinley, Joseph McGinley, Eddie Gillespie, Brian Byrne, Mick Carr, Dan Byrne, Bernard Byrne, Phil McNeils, Michael W. Cunningham, Gorde McGroarty and Hugh O'Gara.
