



'WEESHIE' Ó FÓGARTAIGH (Ciarraí), who is refereeing today's Senior semifinal, also handled the 1981 semi-final between An Dún and Uíibh Fháilí and last year's semi-final between Gaillimh and Uíbh Fháilí.

He has been refereeing for nine years and has been in charge of Ciarraí finals in all grades, including five Senior finals. He has handled N.F.L. games all over the country and was in charge of this year's N.F.L. semi-final between An Dún and Cill Dara and the N.F.L. final between An Dún and Ard Mhacha.

In 1979 he was in charge of the Ceannáras semi-final between Baile Átha Cliath and Muineacháin and the following year was in charge of the 1980 All-Ireland Under 21 final between Corcaigh and Baile Átha Cliath and the All-Ireland Club final between St. Finbarr's (Corcaigh) and St. Grellan's (Gaillimh).

'Weeshie' is chairman of the Ciarraí Referees' Committee and Chairman of the Legion Club in Killarney. Married, with three children, he is a Psychiatric Nurse in St. Finian's Hospital. PÁDRAIG Ó CAOMHÁNAIGH (An Mhí, who was in charge of the minor football preliminary game between Londain and Nua Eabhrach, is refereeing his first All-Ireland minor semi-final today.

Pádraig was in charge of the 1980 Leinster Senior final between Baile Átha Cliath and Uibh Fháilí and handled the 1980 and 1981 Leinster Under 21 finals. He has also refereed Leinster Under 14 and Minor finals, an O'Byrne Cup final and an All-Ireland Vocational Schools final.

As a player, he won county Intermediate medals with Dunderry in 1970 and with Bohermeen, his present club, in 1973. Secretary of An Mhí hurling and football leagues, he is also chairman of the county's Referees' Association. Married, with five children, he is a Furniture Manufacturer.

Eolas ar Thoireann Dún na nGall

NOEL McCOLE (St. Eunan's): Age 30. Played his first game for the county in the 1974 Ulster final replay and has been the county's regular goalkeeper ever since. Holds a McKenna Cup medal and two Ulster S.F.C. medals. Bank Official in Letterkenny.

TOMMY McDERMOTT (Aodh Rua, Ballyshannon): Age 21. His father, Jackie, was Dún na nGall's goalkeeper in the 1954 All-Ireland Junior Football final. Tommy himself won an All-Ireland Colleges 'B' medal with De la Salle, Ballyshannon and was centre half-back on last year's All-Ireland winning Under 21 team. A student at Sligo R.T.C.

MARTIN GRIFFIN (Seán McCumhaill's): Age 28. From Stranolar, won a McKenna Cup medal in 1975 and a Dún na nGall S.F.C. medal in 1977. Has also played hurling for the county. County Council employee.

DES NEWTON (Urris): Age 22. Played at right-back for his native Ros Comáin when they won the All-Ireland Under 21 title in 1978. Took the injured Matt Gallagher's place before the Ulster semifinal and Charlie Mulgrew's place before the Ulster final. Teacher in Carndonagh Community School.

BRENDAN DUNLEAVY (Seán McCumhaill's): Aged 26. Made his Senior debut for the county in October 1974. Won McKenna Cup medal in 1975, a county S.F.C. medal in 1977, four Sigerson Cup medals and All-Ireland Club Championship medal with U.C.D. Teacher in Greendale Community School.

MICHAEL LAFFERTY (Seán McCumhaill's): Aged 28. Winner of the June 1983 B & I Award. Won Ulster College's Handball medals with St. Macartan's, Monaghan. Played at midfield against Gaillimh in 1974. Won County S.F.C. medal in 1977 as well as his two Ulster S.F.C. medals. Trainer of last year's successful Under 21 team. Teacher in Abbey V.S.

MICHAEL CARR (Kilcar): Age 29. Man of the match in Ulster final. Had won Ulster S.F.C. medal in 1974 also. Won McKenna Cup medal in 1975 and county S.F.C. medal in 1980. Colleges' star with Holy Cross College, Falcarragh, in the early seventies. Shopkeeper.

ANTHONY MOLLOY (Ardara): Age 21. A member of the All-Ireland winning Under 21 team of 1982 and of this year's Under 21 side. Won county S.F.C. medal with Ardara in 1981. Past pupil of Glenties Comprehensive School. E.S.B. employee.

PAUL McGETTIGAN (St. Eunan's): Age 28. Won an All-Ireland Colleges medal with Gormanstown in 1973. Played against Gaillimh and with Gaillimh and won a county S.F.C. medal with St. Grellan's, but has declared for his native Letterkenny and the county this year. Health Board Official.

DONAL REID (Bundoran): Age 22. Another member of the 1982 Under 21 team. A native of Crossroads, Killygordan, and a former Red Hughs' player. Hotel manager in Bundoran.

CHARLIE MULGREW (St. Eunan's): Age 22. Broke his jaw in the Ulster semi-final and so missed the final. Born in Dungannon. On the St. Eunan's College team that won the All-Ireland Colleges 'B' title in 1979. Centre-Forward on last year's All-Ireland winning Under 21 team. Student at Letterkenny R.T.C.

JOYCE McMULLAN (Four Masters): Age 20. County Champions Four Masters only representative on the team, he is another member of last year's winning Under 21 side. Won a county S.F.C. medal last year. Past pupil of Abbey Vocational School. Insurance company representative.

MARTIN McHUGH (Kilcar): Age 22. The team's top championship scorer despite missing the Muineacháin match through injury. Played for Ulster's successful Railway Cup team this year and went to America as an All-Star replacement. Star of the winning All-Ireland Under 21 side. Won county S.F.C. medal in 1980. Factory worker.

SEAMUS BONNAR (Civil Service): Age 33. Only Dún na nGall player to win three Ulster S.F.C. medals with his native county. Played at midfield in All-Ireland semi-finals of 1972 and 1974. Won a McKenna Cup medal in 1975 and a Baile Átha Cliath S.F.C. medal with Civil Service. Garda.

KIERAN KEENEY (Ardara): Age 30. Won Ulster S.F.C. medals in 1974 and 1983 and a county S.F.C. medal in 1980. P. & T. Employee.

PADRAIG COYNE (Milltown): Aged 23. Is current club captain. Won an All-Ireland minor medal with Gaillimh in 1976 when only 16, and an All-Ireland Colleges championship medal with St. Colman's College in 1977; he played at full back on that side. Also holds N.F.L. and Connacht Senior medals.

JOHNNY HUGHES (Mountbellew): Age 32. Won a Connacht Junior medal in 1972 before winning the first of five Connacht Senior medals in 1973. Was honoured as an Allstar in 1974 and 1976. Also holds N.F.L. medal. Company representative.

STEPHEN KINNEAVY (Newbridge, Co. Kildare): Aged 28. Played all his club football with his native club in Connemara, Clonbur, until he moved to Newbridge. Holds N.F.L. and Connacht Senior medals. Garda.

MATTIE COLEMAN (Monivea): Aged 24. Dual player and a former St. Jarlath's player. Was right full back on the team that won the All-Ireland Minor title in 1976. Played some of his early county senior football at centre half. Garda.

PAT O'NEILL (Tuam Stars): Age 27. The regular right half back since 1977. Holds three All-Ireland 7-a-side, four Gaillimh senior championship, All-Ireland Inter-Firm, N.F.L. and Connacht senior medals. Computer Data Processor.

PETER LEE (Caherlistrane): Age 28. Has been a member of the Senior panel since the mid 70's and has played at half-back, midfield and half-forward for the side. Holds an N.F.L. and two Connacht medals. Garda.

SEAMUS. McHUGH (Headford): Age 28. An All-Star in 1981, he is equally adept in defence or attack. In 1981 Seamus won the Bank of Ireland Student Sports Stars poll award and was also Co. Galway Footballer of the Year. Holds two Dublin Under-21 medals. Teacher.

BRIAN TALTY (Tuam Stars): Aged 27. Another former St. Jarlath's College star – he once played in goal for St. Jarlath's in an All-Ireland final. Broke an ankle training with the Dublin footballers early last year, but resumed for the Connacht final. Holds All-Ireland club, N.F.L. and Connacht Senior medals. P.E. Teacher.

PADDY KELLY (Moycullen): Age 23. Holds a Connacht Under-21 medal and made his senior debut against Maigh Eó in last month's Connacht final when he won his first provincial Senior Final.

VAL DALY (Mountbellew): Aged 21. Man of the match performance when Carmelite College, Moate won the All-Ireland final in 1980, from the centre half back position. Has played a lot of football at midfield but has now settled on the 'forty'. Trainee Forester.

BRIAN O'DONNELL (Salthill): Age 22. A former rugby interprovincial player, he has been a regular member of the squad for the past two years. Holds two Connacht Senior medals. Western Health Board employee.

TOM NAUGHTON (Annaghdown): Aged 31. The only link with the side that won the All-Ireland minor title in 1970 – he was a sub on that team. Also holds All-Ireland Under-21, five Connacht Senior N.F.L. medals. Salesman.

GAY McMANUS (Milltown): Aged 25. Has been the most prolific scorer on the Gaillimh side since he made his senior debut, while still only 18, in 1976. In that year he was full forward on the Gaillimh team that won the All-Ireland minor title. Captained UCG to win the Sigerson Cup in 1980. Teacher.

STEPHEN JOYCE (Clonbur): Aged 26. Scored the crucial penalty goal against Ros Comáin in last year's Connacht semifinal. Won an All-Ireland Vocational Schools medal with Maigh Eó, while attending school in Ballinrobe, Post Office Employee.

THE ONLY previous championship meeting of today's senior semi-finalists took place on August 18, 1974, before a crowd of 33,782.

Gaillimh, the more experienced side, began the opening quarter intent on establishing an unassailable lead and after 11 minutes had opened a 1–4 to 0–0 lead. To their credit, Dún na nGall didn't collapse and, aided by a Seamus Bonnar goal from a penalty, trailed by one point by the 18th minute.

At the interval, the Connacht Champions, having played with the breeze which blew into the Canal goal led by 2–7 to 1–6 and neutrals sensed that the Ulster side were in with a chance. However, they squandered too many chances while Gaillimh, sensing that they were the better side, led by 3–11 to 1–8, with 15 minutes remaining.

Then Gaillimh seemed to grow complacent and Dún na nGall scored six successive points without ever threatening to upset the better team and Gaillimh came back to score the final two points.




