

A Sign of the Times

DONEGAL may find winning the Sam Maguire Cup a difficult assignment but if trophies were to be presented for media coverage of GAA, then the county would win hands down.



Four newspapers - the Donegal Democrat, Derry People and Donegal News, Donegal's People's Press and Derry Journal – afford virtual saturation coverage in the print media.

In addition, four radio stations - Highland, North West, Radio Na Gaeltachta and Radio Foyle – ensure that massive emphasis is placed on all aspects of our Association's activities on the airwaves.

Obviously this type of blanket coverage guarantees that the GAA is marketed in a manner which is the envy of many other counties.

But it brings its own particular pressures, let it be said.

The pronounced 'hype' will not of itself breed success but it surely helps to promote the aims of the Association and the games.

While these ideals are admirable, we now live in a society where success would appear to have assumed even added importance.

Donegal suporters, among the most fervent and loyal in the country, understandably want to see their county hoisted onto a pedestal as the best team in the country.


That may or may not happen in the coming weeks but one thing is certain – their bid to become the first side from Ulster to carry off football's greatest prize since Down's feat in 1968 will be chronicled in the greatest depth imaginable.

Just recently, Donegal even achieved another media 'first' with the Democrat's Annette O'Donnell becoming the first lady journalist to receive the authorised Ulster Council GAA Press Pass.

A sign of the times – and a good one at that – but an indication, too, that Donegal are trend-setters when it comes to feeding an insatiable public appetite in the north-west for facts and statistics on the country's top sport.



Goals have been plentiful in the Championship so far, two in Omagh and four at Casement Park. Joe Kennedy's after two minutes for Antrim was the quickest. Will that be beaten?

The side scoring the first goal in those first two games, Cush for Tyrone and Kennedy for Antrim, have ended up as losers!

The Donegal-Cavan clash last year scored a first. Two players were sent off but Anthony Molloy was later suspended, video evidence used for the first time!

Donegal had a successful league campaign, losing only in the semi-final to Kildare. Cavan, in contrast, were relegated to Division Three. That will all count for little, mind you, in today's game

Cavan were the first Ulster team to lift the Sam Maguire Cup. They beat Galway in the 1933 final, ending Kerry's bid for five titles in a row when they defeated the men from the Kingdom with a last minute goal

Everybody has heard of the legendary Cavan great but what was Gunner Brady's first name? Phillip, of course!

A personal best tally in an All-Ireland Semi-final is 14 points, scored in 1972 by Tony McTeague, against Donegal!

The results of the last two championship meetings between today's opponents were Cavan 0-9 Donegal 0-13 and Cavan 0-14 Donegal 3-12. Those matches were played in the last two years, of course.

Cavan's last title came in 1969 when they defeated Down 2-13 to 2-6 in Belfast. Their last final was in 1983 when they lost to Donegal!

In 1880 Maghera McFinns represented Cavan in the Ulster Final, losing by 3 points to 1 to Inniskeen Grattans of Monaghan. Donegal's first appearance was in 1963, beaten 2-11 to 1-4 by Down at Breffni Park



Minor Focus

Cavan dominated Ulster senior football for so long that it was a case of who would come second. Thirty-eight titles the Breffni Blues tucked away during their northern reign but strangely the minors failed to match their big brothers.

One would have thought that the under-18s would have travelled in the slip stream of their elders. That the glory trail would have been easier to follow but that wasn't the case. Just five minor football crowns found a resting place in Breffniland and only two of them were achieved during the Cavan senior dominance which more or less lasted from the early twenties until the late forties.

Today, fresh faced young lions from Cavan will tackle the sunset trail once again with Donegal holding the first gate. Donegal has been even less successful than Cavan at minor level with just two titles won but they have been more prominent in recent years.

Cavan's last title arrived in 1974 when Derry were on the wrong end of a 2-9 to 1-4 scoreline. Donegal first brought home the bacon in '56 when they bettered Armagh by 2-6 to 0-5 - then suffered an agonising wait until John Cunningham raised the trophy high again in '85, after Cavan's colours - yes, Cavan was the opposition – were lowered to the tune of 2-11 to 1-3.

Success at minor level does not guarantee top senior status. Far from it but it can be a great help just the same. Very few minor players go out on the field without dreaming of the future and seeing themselves the stars of Croke Park one day.

For the moment, it would be enough for the Cavan and Donegal young pretenders to achieve winning status this afternoon. They would reckon, and rightly so, that victory could be the launching pad to greater things. It could be, provided the momentum was kept going and the feet stayed flatly on terra firma.

Yes, dreams will be envisaged and dreams will be shattered in minor championship football. There will be heads dropping in the losers' dressing room this afternoon but one thing that the Cavan and Donegal young hopefuls don't have to worry about is tradition. Players from the past have not burdened today's squads with that pressure which goes with having to live up to trail blazing predecessors.


