



#### LORD MAYOR'S GREETING

In offering my congratulations to the Four Masters G.A.A. Club, I am conscious of the great achievement this development has been at a time when the club, like so many others, had to contend with financial constraints placed on it by the present recession. It was only by hard work and persistence that a handful of dedicated men were able to overcome this problem. They were encouraged in their project by very generous support

they received from the local community and from outside the area.

The opening of Tirconaill Park on June 6th 1954 gave a permanent home to the club, and was the culmination of a dream cherished by Donegal Gaels for almost fifty years. It was on a cold winter's night in October 1905 - Friday 20th to be exact, that a small group of visionaries sat around a table in a local factory and set up the first ever hurling/football club in the town. It was at the suggestion of Harry McCafferty and Frank Cornyn that the club was named "The Balldearg Hurling and Football Club." The man who presided that night was the late P.M. Gallagher, the solicitor who briefed Padraig Pearse in the famous MacGiolla Bridghe case, the only brief Pearse was ever to conduct in court. Many years ago, well over forty anyway, I was given a photograph of an early Balldearg team for publication, and when I tried to identify the players, I was disappointed to find that very little was known about that first club. I then decided to do some research with a view to preparing a short history/newspaper feature. There was a few of the original members still alive. These men were Joe McCloskey, Jimmy Weir and Jim McGahern. Their recollections formed what could be described as the first history of the Balldeargs. This I used some years later as a newspaper feature. The material I had already supplied to a number of interested columnists. The Balldeargs played their first game against Townawilly Four Masters. (Hurling). A close relationship has existed between these two areas right down to the present day. Donegal Four Masters have been playing their games in recent times on the G.A.A. pitch at Miltown in Townawilly.

Over fifty years, successive Donegal teams used a number of venues but didn't have a permanent home. Some of the venues have since become housing sites, these included Britton's Field (Drumrooske) Dr. Warnock's (Glebe), Harkins Field, Quinns (Miltown) McMullins (Drumlonagher).

This new Tirconaill Park is indeed a worthy home for a worthy club, and a fitting memorial to the few ardent Gaels who, 87 years ago, created a heritage that proudly passed to men who recognise it's value and cherish it. Again I congratulate the Four Masters, not only on this achievement, great though it is, but also on the way they have distinguished themselves over the years, and brought honour to our town.





### **ONE OF THE GREATS**

PATSY BROGAN



The burden of being "one of the greats" may rest uneasily on the shoulders of many players, and perhaps sometimes undeservedly. There can be no doubt, that this is not the case when we talk of Patsy Brogan. He was, and will always be "one of the greats". His long career was lined with many outstanding performances, none greater than in 1952 when he was superb while marking the great Eamonn Young of Cork in the National Football League Semi-Final. Patsy made his debut for the club in 1943 in the County Junior final against Fort

Lennon which Donegal duly won 2-4 to 1-6. Patsy never won a Co. Senior medal, despite being part of a very talented Four Masters team. He did however, win two "Democrat Cup" medals in 1948 and 1949. Patsy also won several Connolly Cup medals, which was a fifteen a side Divisional competition. At inter-county level, Patsy was a real stalwart for Donegal and he won a Lagan Cup medal in 1952 when Donegal beat Armagh. His brothers Angus, Jim and Liam all played for the club, and Liam went on to play for the county. Although Patsy never won that elusive Senior medal he was a very proud man in Ballybofey on August 26th 1984 when he watched his son Paschal won such a medal with Four Masters. 1984 turned out to be a very special year for Patsy because, on top of Paschal's success, he himself had the honour of being chosen on the "Team of the Century." That was surely a fitting tribute to one of the best players ever to wear, the blue and white of Four Masters, and green and gold of Donegal. To describe Patsy Brogan I can only quote his old playing partner Joe Kelly when he said "When you needed Patsy, he was there.

# Donegal v. Down - A History

Since the Donegal Senior team made their debut in the Ulster Championship in 1906, they have had Down as their opponents on a total of 15 occasions. The Mournmen have definitely had the better of things being victorious on 9 occasions, and Donegal coming out on top in the remaining six. The first time our two counties met was in 1939 when Donegal won by 0-6 to 1-1. Another decade would pass before the next encounter, with Donegal winning again, this time by 2-6 to 0-8. A year later, Down were to record their first win over us, when they were victorious by 4-3 to 1-7, but that was only after a high scoring drawn game which ended 3-5 to 2-8. In 1957, we were again pitted against the great Down men, and got revenge for the previous defeat, winning comfortably 3-2 to 0-6. In 1958 Down began, what turned out to be a six match unbeaten run against us when they beat us by 3-11 to 3-5. Their other victories were 1963: 2-11 to 1-4 (Ulster Final); 1966 1-7 to 0-8; 1967: 2-8 to 2-5; 1968: 2-14 to 0-8; 1971: 3-14 to 3-6; In 1972 the rot stopped for Donegal when we beat Down by 1-8 to 0-8. That victory was a great boost for Donegal football, and that year saw us lift our first Ulster Senior championship. In 1974 we met Down for the second time in an Ulster Final, and after an exciting drawn game 1-14 to 2-11, Donegal won the replay by 3-9 to 1-12 to lift their second Ulster title. That Donegal team included our own Donal Monaghan who actually got the "Man of the Match" award for his display at corner back. Eleven years were to pass before we would meet each other again. In a tremendous game in Ballybofey, Donegal, inspred by the brilliant Martin mcHugh, defeated Down by 2-12 to 2-8. In 1986, we travelled to the beautiful setting of Newry, only to return home empty handed. And so on to last year when Down had a resounding victory over a pathetic Donegal team. They fully deserved their victory and went on to do their county and their province proud, by capturing the All-Ireland title. Will Donegal and Down meet in 1992. Only time will tell, as a lot of football is to be played yet, if we were to meet again in an Ulster Final. Whatever the outcome of this years championship, Donegal and Down have had many great battles since 1939, and I'm sure the trend will continue for many years to come.

#### **HURLING IN DONEGAL TOWN**

Before the G.A.A. was founded in County Donegal, Caman was an established pastime in the county, and so, when the G.A.A. was first established in Donegal Town under the "Balldeargs", hurling existed. The records however, do not produce any continuity of hurling in the area. during those turbulent early years, but the arrival of David Hanna in the early thirties, re-introduced the hurling into the club. Teams from the club took part in 7-a-side tournaments, a very important part of G.A.A. activities at the time. Through the experience gained in these tournaments, the club made a lot of progress at the game of hurling, and this led to the winning of the County Junior Championship in 1938. The game was played on and off during the forties. The arrival of Jim Dunphy from Laois sparked another revival. In 1955, the club won the Co. Senior Championship and a local juvenile league was established. From that league emerged a few fine hurlers. A few of these, Patrick hanna, Donal Gallagher, Walter Espey and Harry Stewart won County U16 medals in 1955 with Aodh Ruadh Ballyshannon. An adult team was last fielded in the 1960's, while underage teams continued to compete in the 70's and 80's. In fact there were hopes of a revival in the 80's when Donal Gallagher put together a fine team and won Divisional titles at U14 and U16 level. It was hoped that a Senior team could once again be formed, but with immigration and other factors, this never came about, unfortunately. During this time, Kieran Twomey won two All-Ireland medals with the County at U16 level. The arrival of Mr. and Mrs. Tommy Brennan has once again renewed interest in hurling at under-age level, and last year the most successful hurling league in the clubs history was run, for boys and girls up to 11 years of age, and over 50 children took part. We hope this trend can be continued. A few players from the club have won major honours at County level. Of these, Sean Mullin and Anthony McBrearty won Ulster Junior medals in 1947 and 1948. Stephen McCormack won the same award in 1972, and Tommy Brennan followed suit in 1989. Tommy was also chosen as "Hurler of the Year" in 1991, a deserved honour for him and a great boost for the club. We hope that the lovely game of hurling can now be continued, and be enjoyed by our young people.





#### **Anthony McBrearty**



A very modest, and likeable character, Anthony McBrearty gave twenty three years loyal service to the club as a player, and many more as a supporter and official. Coming from a family whose love for Gaelic Games is well documented, Anthony became a very popular personality in the club, through his efforts on, and off the field. Anthony was, and still is, held in great esteem by his fellow players, and it is not too hard to get someone to tell of one of his many towering displays for the club. He first played for his native town as a minor, in the early thirties. County selection was always going to be the most likely progression for him, and he went on to play for

Donegal at Minor, Junior and at Senior level. Anthony was also a very talented hurler, and he won two Ulster Junior hurling medals in 1947 and 1948. Like many dual players, even up to the present day, he preferred the more skilful game of hurling to football. Success with the club was never an easy achievement in Anthony's time. The Championship was played on a Divisional basis, and Ballyshannon had a very strong team. Although the towns were great rivals on the field, Anthony regards P.J. Goan and Red Jack Gallagher from the Erneside town, as two of the best players in his time. Anthony had the great pleasure of captaining the club's Senior team to their two Democrat Cup" wins in 1948 and 1949. He regards those teams, as the best ever to represent the club. Like all his fellow players in those years, Anthony never had the honour of winning a County Senior Championship medal, and this has remained as his greatest regret. He was naturally delighted to see the club take two County Senior titles in 1982 and 1984, even more so because those teams included his nephew Michael. Anthony played his last game for the club in 1953 against Glenties out In Montgomery's field. His live for the game has never died, and would do it all over again, if it were possible. This club is priviliged to have been served by so many great individuals, and Anthony McBrearty is rightly regarded as one of them.

1984 was always going to be a special year in the Gaelic Athletic Association. as the entire country celebrated Centenary Year. As the sporting spotlight shone on the G.A.A., it became very obvious to all of us, success of any kind, in any competition, was going to be that little bit more special in 1984. The Four Masters Senior team created for themselves such a place in the G.A.A. in Donegal, when they won the County



Senior Championship, and brought the Dr. Maguire Cup through the gap, for the second time in three years. That victory brought to an end, one of the best years of competition in the Senior Championship, for a long time. Following a major setback in 1983, when they were beaten in the first round by Ardara, the Senior team set out, with a point to prove, that they could add to that famous victory of 1982. Without doubt the highlight in John Joe's long career was seeing his beloved Four Masters lift the County Senior Championship in 1982 and 1984. As for today, there will be no prouder man in the vicinity of Tirconaill Park than our President. It is great to see him looking so well, and his interest in the game still as fresh as over. Although he is not as sprightly as he used to be, John Joe tries to get to as many matches as he can, thanks mainly to his long-time friend Danny McMenamin. 

Donal's contribution to Donegal G.A.A. has not been confined to his playing days. He was a mentor with the Donegal U-21 team which won the All-Ireland title in 82. This was surely the icing on the cake for Donal, a very popular and likeable figure. Donal lives on the outskirts of Donegal with his lovely wife, Margaret, and their three sons, Don, Barry and Marcus. Incidentally, Margaret's uncle was the late Anthony Dunlevy who, in his day, was an outstanding footballer. We are glad to see that the three Monaghan boys are keeping the proud tradition of the Monaghan family alive in the G.A.A.



#### Drumbar v. Four Masters – 25th Oct., 1964 DRUMBAR 2-7; FOUR MASTERS 2-6



#### **Did You Know**

The 1952 County Senior Football Final between Killybegs and St. Eunans was played in Donegal Town, out in Montgomery's field. There was a huge crowd at the game, and the gate receipts were £75 6sh 4d. The Killybegs team emerged the victors on the day, on a scoreline of 0-9 to 1-5. It was their first ever County Senior title, and indeed they went on to win the double of League and Championship. Among the players on that talented Killybegs team was the late Conal McCauley from Tirconaill Street.

Stephen McCormack, who resides at the Clar road, was generally regarded as one of the finest exponents of the game of hurling in the county. He was a member of the successful Donegal team which won the Ulster Junior Hurling Championship, when they defeated Monaghan by 5-3 to 5-1. The game was played at Clones on the 6th June 1972. Indeed Clones was very good to Donegal in 1972.

There have been two County Senior football finals played at our own Tirconaill Park. In 1959 Sean mac Cumhaills defeated Kilcar by 2-7 to 1-6 to win their first football championship. The second final was in 1975, when the mighty St. Josephs team of that period, beat Sean mac Cumhaills on a scoreline of 1-11 to 1-5. That victory completed the "three in a row" for the Ballyshannon-Bundoran outfit.

Around 1934, Donegal Town had a very good seven a side team. One Sunday at a competition in Dunkineely, the late Joe Brennan happened to be collecting the money at the gate. The medals were on display, and the late Joe Lawn, confident in the ability of his own team, remarked to Mr. Brennan "wrap up the medals for us will you". As things transpired, Donegal, the strong favourites, were beaten in the first round by what was described as a very average Dunkineely team. Joe Brennan, quite rightly, got a great laugh out of this incident, and any time Joe Lawn and himself met, it was sure to be discussed.



Termon were the next team to be beaten and that left us in the semi-final with St. Michaels. With a County Final in sight, there was no way that St. Michaels were going to stand in our way. The County Final was a nail-biting affair, with Killybegs the opposition. Thanks to a great team performance, the County Junior title was on its way to Donegal Town. The final score of 1-8 to 1-6 was greeted with great joy by the team and loyal supporters. All the hard training had paid off, especially the torturous discipline of pushing tar-barrells, at which the vicecaptain became an expert. With the County title safely tucked away, and the long hours of deserved celebrations over, the Junior team took part in the unofficial Ulster Junior Championship. Four counties took part in the finals, which were held in Dunnamanagh, Derry, Down, Tyrone and Donegal. As if to prove that the talent in the club was as good as anywhere, our boys duly won the Ulster Junior Championship. It was a great achievement by the squad and is recalled to this day with a great deal of satisfaction. Although many of the players did not have any further success, they can be assured that the County Junior Championship is a golden memory for us all.

In the County Final that year, he was simply brilliant against Ardara and it has always been a pleasure to see Joyce at his best. Since that great day, Joyce has overcome a very serious back injury and, it is to his credit, that he returned to the top-flight. He added a second Ulster Senior medal to his collection in 1990 when Donegal defeated a good Armagh team in Clones. Once again Donegal's hopes were dashed at the semi-final stage, this time by Meath. However, we received some satisfaction when it was announced that joyce was selected as an All Star. Joyce, we are sure, still has plenty to offer Donegal football, but he can be assured that he has served the County well and done his club proud.



#### **CAMOGIE**

Camogie was first introduced to the club in 1935 by the late Dave Hanna.

The ladies continued to play for the club for four years, under the chairperson Mai O'Donnell, but the games then ceased for a few years, until in 1944 they reformed with Susie McBrearty playing a prominent part.

Prominent players of that time were Nellie Conaghan, Lil Diver, Alice McMullin and

Aggie McCallion, to mention but a few.

Training took place in Montgomery's field, under the supervision of Dave Hanna and

Sean Mullan, who were the driving forces behind the camogie.

The ladies travelled to matches in those days in the back of Christy Gallagher's lorry, and they enjoyed an early success when reaching a County Final against Cloghan. With just minutes remaining in that game, Donegal were awarded a free, and the chance to level the scores. As the ball was struck, and going on its way over the bar, the referee blew the whistle and Donegal lost by just the single point.

In those early days, the club colours were maroon and saffron, with the words "Ingean Dubh" printed on the front. The colours were later changed to maroon and white.

Lil Diver was regarded as a very accomplished goalkeeper in her playing days. She had, however, the most unusual way of catching the ball. Much to the amusement of her opponents, she used her gym frock instead of her hands and there was no way for them to get it off her, the ball that is!

In the past few years, Mary Walsh has done trojan work for the game of camogie in



He served as Treasurer for a time, and was a committee member from 1940 to 1962. It is a delight to talk to Joe at any time, as he has a great knowledge of the game, and a long memory for facts in relation to the club's history. Joe first played for the club at 17 years of age and developed a great love for the game. His



teacher at school, Master McGovern, was a source of inspiration for Joe, and he remembers that to buy a football at that time meant the pupils raising about half the price, and the Master paying the rest. Joe attended St. Eunan's College and played his first ever game with them, when they played a match against the Glenties Senior team. Joe was a vital member of the club's Senior team when they won the "Democrat Cup" in 1948 and 1949. He still rates those teams as the best ever to represent the club, but does not hide his admiration for the Senior teams that won the County Championship in '82 and '84. Joe has a great love for the youth of the town and is delighted to see that they are being so well catered for. He was never sent off during his playing days, but very honestly admits, that once or twice, he could easily have been dismissed for speaking back to referees. The best player that Joe ever met at club level was Columba McDyer and Mick Higgins of Cavan at inter-county level. Joe lived for the game and would do it all over again without hesitation. He is a retired man now, and residing with his wife at Drumlonagher. Joe is a lovely man to talk to and would gladly talk about the old days from morning till night. He can rest assured that his dedication to the club has not been forgotten and the memories of his great performances still recalled with pride.





However, the team were to learn from their mistakes in that game, and made a promise to themselves that evening in trummon, to give the county competition their best shot. That extra determination was in evidence when they had to overcome the challenge of reigning County champions, Cloughaneely, in the Co. quarter-final. Shane Griffin scored a hat-trick of goals to steer us into the Co. semi-final. Ardara were the only obstacle in our path to reaching the County Final. In one of the best games at under-age level I have ever seen, the Four Masters boys took all Ardara efforts in their stride, and a magnificent team effort saw them into that treasured County Final. The final, as they say, is history, but no words can fully describe the joy and satisfaction that hot July Sunday brought to us. The final score was Four Masters 1-5, Muff 2-0. Team Manager Frank O'Donnell and all the boys deserve their little piece of history.





### HISTORY OF THE PLAYING FIELDS IN DONEGAL TOWN

In the early days of the G.A.A. in this county, Donegal Town was no different to any other town, in that facilities and playing pitches were non-existent. In those times, when a game was to take place, word usually went round pretty quickly and the game took place in whatever field was available locally. In most cases the field was not marked or lined in any way. The main objective was for the game to go ahead, In those early days, games were played in Drumstevlin and a number of venues in Drumrooske, one of which was Devaney's field, now the home of the Kelly family. Games were played at Miltown where the Picture Mouldings factory is situated, and Dr. Warnock's field, now better known as the site for the Abbey Vocational School, and it is great to see games taking place there once more.

In 1932. the club, now known as the Four Masters, moved to Montgomery's field in Drumlonagher (now the N.B.A. field), and this remained for a long time a major venue for the G.A.A. in County Donegal. Named "Tirconaill Park", some renowned Four Masters v. Ballyshannon games were played there, and also the Britton seven-a-side tournament which attracted the top teams in the county to this venue. It also hosted the 1952 County Senior Final between Killybegs and St. Eunans, which drew a then record attendance, one of many county finals to

be played there.

At this time, the Ulster Council were encouraging clubs to purchase their own playing grounds. The Four Masters committee felt that this would be a positive step towards the development of Gaelic games in this area and approaches were made to the then owners of Montgomery's field, the Doherty family, Belleek, but they were reluctant to sell. After looking at a number of venues, the committee of the day decided in favour of a field belonging to Mr. Dom Breslin Snr. The Chairman of the club at the time was Joe Kelly, and the club minute book records "A discussion took place about purchase of the field from Mr. Dom Breslin. It was agreed to have it vested in the G.A.A. That historic decision took place on the 12th June, 1950. Before any work could commence, the purchase price for the "New Tirconaill Park" had to be found. In this regard, the townspeople gathered £300 and the town development committee came along with £100. The race committee also donated £100 and the club raised £70 and so the "New Tirconaill Park" was now official G.A.A. property.

Contracts for the development were signed and after much work and fundraising, the "New Tirconaill Park" was officially opened by the then Bishop of Raphoe, the late Most Rev. Dr. McNeely, on Sunday, 6th June, 1954. Two games took place on that historic occasion, Donegal v. Leitrim as a curtain-raiser to the Cavan v. Mayo match. Many players graced the pitch on that day, who were household names throughout the country and, indeed, Down, the All-Ireland chamoions of 1968, played Donegal in a challenge game at Tirconaill Park.

Due to the rapid development of Gaelic games in the club, and the county, the playing pitch suffered from over-use and problems with drainage occurred. Several unsuccessful attempts were made to remedy this problem, without doubt an unforeseen one, resulting in a decision being taken in the mid-

seventies to seek an alternative site for development. Many prospective sites were surveyed but no natural one could be found which did not involve massive expenditure on site levelling, drainage, etc. In 1985 a field adjoining Tirconaill Park became available and was purchased for £25,000. This allowed major reconstruction to go ahead to assist the club in making the playing pitch much longer and wider. Designs for the drainage and re-construction were sought and committee members inspected many newly developed grounds. Eventually the contract was awarded to McFadden & Co. and signed on November 20th, 1987. In the intervening years, the massive work undertaken by the committee in financing this project has received unbelievable support locally, county wide, nationally and internationally. The closure of Tirconaill Park resulted in the relocation of club games, but alternative pitches were available, thanks to: Francie Monaghan, Farmhill; the N.B.A. pitch at Drumlonagher; Danny McMenamin of Clarelougheske, and Townawilly which has been our home since 1982. Indeed we are very grateful to Tommy McNulty, who has been most helpful in keeping the pitches in good condition. In the last year, a pitch for our under-age activities has been made available at Killymard thanks to Fr. Eoghan O'Frighil.

And so, Tirconaill Park re-opens today after a long absence and a major redevelopment project. Just like the original committee, the club has depended on the local community for help, and it is to their credit that they have not been found wanting. It is very important that the efforts of so many people down the years were not wasted and we are very proud today to see the fruits of many

hours of hard labour being rewarded.

#### **Four Masters are U-21 County Champions**

### ONE OF THE GREATS Joe Lawn

When Joe Lawn died on the 8th June 1991, Donegal lost one of it's finest characters and without doubt, one of it's most talented footballers of all time. Although his career was cut very short due to injury, Joe Lawn had already distinguished himself, as one of the best full-backs the county has ever had. As there was no under-age football in his time, Joe did not play for the club until 1932, and that was at Senior level. Success at club level never arrived for Joe, so it was left to the inter-county scene to give him his sporting highlights. The medals he won were a Dr. McKenna Cup in 1935, a Dr. Lagan Cup in 1934 and an Ulster



Junior Championship in 1933, when a man he greatly admired, the late Jim McEnhill played in goals. In 1933, the County Junior team went on to qualify for the All Ireland Final where they met a brilliant Mayo team. They were soundly beaten on the day, but Joe greatly enjoyed the occasion. In his opinion, Sean Purcell of Galway, was the best player he ever saw at County level, an opinion that many share, and Joe rates Jim Smyth of Cavan as Ulster's best ever performer. As regards Donegal players, Joe regarded James P. McGinley as one of his favourites. Joe Lawn was regarded as one of the most sporting individuals ever to play for club or county, and throughout his life, loved the game to be played as it ought to be. Although he did not live to see the Sam Maguire Cup enter, the county, Joe got great pleasure from the County success at All Ireland level. He was a great lover of the Four Masters club, and was thrilled when they won the County Senior Championship in 1982 and 1984. Joe never managed to win a Senior County medal, like so many of our best players, and he duly put it down to the great teams that were in the Southern Division. It was a great pleasure to know Joe Lawn, and he deserves to be remembered by us all. He was a great Gael, and without doubt "one of our greats".



The late Willie Coulter came on as a substitute in the second-half of a football match against Corlea, in Corlea, in the mid-forties. Instead of wearing the proper footwear, Willie was wearing a new pair of shoes belonging to Jack McMullin. He fired a powerful shot at goals but the keeper made a great save. The keeper happened to be his team-mate Eamonn McCormack and, had it not been for Eamonn's full-length save, Joe would have scored a brilliant, but bizarre, own-goal.

After a hurling match in Ballyshannon many years ago, someone had locked the local school, and the players clothes were inside. One of the local Donegal lads, decided to sort the situation out himself. He took his hurley and smashed one of the windows, so enabling one of his teammates to get inside, and retrieve all the clothing. He then left the money on the grass to pay for the repair of the window. Honesty or What?

One of the favourite pastimes for club players in the past, must have been wearing shoes belonging to Jack McMullin. It seems that Jack was noted for being extremely tidy in the dressing room folding his clothes neatly in one corner. While taking part in a hurling match at Mac Cumhaill Park, Jack was in the middle of the field, when he became involved in a heavy "clash of the ash". While players were swinging their hurleys in all directions, Jack noticed that his cousin Tim McMullin, was wearing his shoes. It is understood, that Jack chased Tim all around the field, in order to tell him a thing or two. A great story.

### ONE OF THE GREATS Jack "Cowboy" McMullin

Jack McMullin first played for the club in 1935 at the age of 16 and he went on to give almost thirty years of service to Donegal football. His early recollections of the game go back to the days when the likes of Paddy O'Brien, G. O'Donnell and Johnny Maguire were playing in the mid-twenties. His first game in 1935 was against Ballyshannon and a few of his team-mates at that time were George Dunnion, Sean Mullin, Charlie Fox and Anthony Dunlevy. In his club days, Jack regards Anthony McBrearty as the finest player to play for Donegal and rates the display of Patsy Brogan in the Democrat Cup Final against the mighty Gweedore as the best individual display he ever witnessed. The County Championship in



those days was played on a knock-out basis and Jack feels that if Donegal had been able to get out of the Division, they would have won a few championships. Jack was a very accomplished player and, indeed, played in thirteen different positions for the club at Senior level. His favourite position was midfield where he enjoyed being in the thick of things, and seeing plenty of the ball. Jack's only success at inter-county level was the winning of a Dr. Lagan Cup medal in 1952 when Donegal defeated Armagh. Jack took part in a Fermanagh County Senior Final with Ederney which they lost and he also played in a Leitrim County Final for Melvin Gaels. On that Gaels' team with Jack were Patsy Brogan and Patsy Furey but defeat was again the outcome. The nickname "Cowboy" was given to Jack by his schoolmates and it stuck with him from then on. Jack's last game for the club was played when he was 42 years of age and, although none of his sons went on to play for the club, his two nephews, Hughie and Michael Travers, gave sterling service. Jack still has a keen interest in the club games and is also a regular attender of County matches.

That U-13 team included a lot of boys who had tasted success with the U-12 team 1989 and disappointment in 1990. The basis for a successful run in the championship was in evidence, but, one vital ingredient was added. That extra ingredient was the dedication and commitment that Gerry Molloy was to supply. When the Divisional campaign got underway the boys showed their obvious

desire for success when they inflicted a five point defeat on Aodh Ruadh at Fr. Tierney Park. That victory set the trend for what was to follow. The team virtually danced through their Divisional campaign, winning the final against Aodh Ruadh by a remarkable scoreline of 7-13 to 1-3. It was hard to see them being tested by any team in the county as easy wins against Glenties and Carndonagh left them in the County Final for the third year in a row. The weather in Ballybofey on the 10th November could not have been much worse as torrential rain and wind spoiled any chances of a good quality game. The opponents were St. Eunans and the Letterkenny boys had most of the early play. However, at half-time, Four Masters led by two points, thanks to a brilliant Barry Monaghan goal. Early in the second half that man Monaghan again scored a goal and, try as they might, St. Eunans could not close the gap. The final scoreline read : Four Masters 2-5, St. Eunans 3-1 - we were county champions again. It may have been raining all around us but there was nothing but sunshine in our hearts. The dedication of the entire squad and management trio of Gerry Molloy, Peter Callaghan and Frank O'Donnell had brought further glory to themselves and to the club. #### **Did You Know**

In the 1954 County Senior Football final, Father Eamonn Mundy played under the name "E McLoone". The reason for him doing this was the fact, that the clergy, were not allowed to participate in games. Perhaps his boss up in heaven was not too pleased with him because, Donegal lost the match. The winners were Gweedore on a scoreline of 3-6 to 0-5.

Gerry Stewart of Castle Street was well known in his younger days as a very competent referee. he got himself a reputation for taking charge of matches, that no other referee would dare take on i.e. the local derby's. The County Secretary at that time was a man from Ardara named Donal Mac A Bhaird. It seems that Donal was a very heavy smoker, and Gerry never received notification of his refereeing duties on official County Board paper. Donal used to send Gerry his fixtures through the post on the back of a cigarette packet. As a matter of interest, the winners of the County Minor Championship receive the Donal mac A bhaird Cup, named after the dedicated Ardara man.

When Donegal last played Down in the Ulster Minor Football Championship on Donegal soil, the match took place at Mac Cumhaill Park on 19th May 1985. The Down team on that occasion contained three members of last years All Ireland winning team. Gary Mason, John Kelly and Barry Breen (who will forget his super goal in the final) Donegal were victorious in that game, and indeed went on to win the Ulster Championship. Of the present Donegal Senior squad, John Cunningham, John Joe Doherty, Tommy Ryan and Barry McGowan were members of that minor team.




