





### ANTHONY MOLLOY'S 100TH APPEARANCE

(by An tAthair Seán Ó Gallchóir)

When Anthony Molloy leads the Donegal team on to the field against Fermanagh on Sunday he will be making his one hundredth appearance for Donegal in senior competitive football. And so, despite an injury - punctuated career, Anthony joins Donegal's three other centurions Donal Reid (112 appearances, excluding next Sunday), Martin McHugh (111) and Joyce McMullen (103) as a magnificent long-serving quartet.

Anthony made his senior inter-county competitive debut against Monaghan on November 14, 1982. He has played against 27 counties (Limerick, Tipperary, Kilkenny and surprisingly neighbours Sligo are the odd-four-out). He has played in 22 Championship matches, 55 League matches, 16 Dr. McKenna Cup games and 6 Centenary/Open Cup games. He has faced Cavan and Armagh more often than any other county - 12 games each against Cavan and Armagh.

Anthony has played most of his football at midfield although he has played on the forty and at full-forward on a number of occasions. His long list of Donegal midfield partners includes Brendan Dunleavy, Pat McCrea, Paul McGettigan, Michael Lafferty, Martin Griffin, Joyce McMullan, Eamonn Breslin, Sylvester Maguire, Martin Gavigan, John Bán Gallagher, Brian Murray, Michael Gallagher, Pádraig Brogan and Barry Cunningham.

Anthony has won an All-Ireland Under-21 F.C. medal (1982); 2 Ulster S.F.C. medals (1983, 1990); 1 Railway Cup medal (1989); 1 Dr. McKenna Cup medal (1991); Donegal Player of the Year Award (1990); a Donegal S.F.C. medal (1981), and a "Democrat Cup" medal (1989).

It is probably true to say that no more popular player has worn the Donegal jersey in recent years than the big lion-hearted gentle giant from Leamagowra. Another special cheer will greet the Ardara man on Sunday as he plays for his County for the one hundredth time.

Matt Gallagher and Charlie Mulgrew have both played 83 games for Donegal: Gary Walsh is on 78. Manus Boyle has played in Donegal's last 31 games.

## INTERESTING DUEL

Two old hands find themselves in confrontation today - and they will share different "goals".

Gary Walsh has been guarding the Donegal net for several seasons now and is one of the most consistent goalkeepers not just in Ulster but in the country as a whole! And while he bids to keep a clean sheet, Dominic Corrigan, another player who has been part and parcel of the championship scene for several seasons will be attempting to make sure the Donegal net bulges - preferably more than once!

It's with Burren that Walsh, a Newry-based accountant, plays his club football and although he has now grown accustomed to the cut and thrust of the Down county league and Championship, his commitment to Donegal is unwavering.

In fact, he thinks nothing of his regular hikes from his adopted Mourne base to his native county for training. And none will be more delighted if Donegal can come up trumps today especially as there is the possibility that Down could form the opposition in the Ulster final.

Dominic Corrigan, though, who plundered a goal and two points against Antrim in Fermanagh's opening joust, plans to ensure that Walsh is denied the opportunity to appear in another Ulster final. The Enniskillen schoolteacher has seldom displayed greater hunger or commitment than this year.

Perhaps it's the success of St. Michael's College in the MacRory Cup competition that has whetted his appetite and perhaps too it's the fact that he feels ten years is too long a spell for Fermanagh to be absent from the Ulster final stage.

Whatever the reason, you can be sure that he will be pulling out all the stops today to "net" a success that would herald a big breakthrough for Fermanagh. They themselves know that they enter the fray as decided underdogs - a team given little or no hope of reaching the final.

But within the Erne camp there is a quiet determination, a quality fuelled by the level-headed approach of manager Hugh McCabe. No-one epitomises the spirit of the squad better than Dominic Corrigan and if he achieves his "goal" today then Fermanagh will be well served!



### DONEGAL V. FERMANAGH

Deja Vu. This semi final last year at Omagh was Donegal v. Fermanagh and Mick Cranny was also the referee. The result that day Donegal 1-18 Fermanagh 0-13.

The captain of the Fermanagh side is Colin Curran who plays for Lisnaskea. They won the county title last season when they beat Newtownbutler 1013 to 1-9.

The current Ulster Minor Champions are Donegal who also won the title in 1956 and 1985. Fermanagh have never won the trophy.

Fermanagh have certainly played their parts off the field as well as on. The current president of the GAA is of course Peter Quinn and after hanging up his boots Big Peter McGinnity is now a television celebrity as a commentator . . . firstly with UTV and now with the BBC.

The GAA is without doubt the most powerful sporting organisation in the country. It has 2,886 clubs, 800,000 members and 306,000 registered players. Impressive figures indeed.

The GAA has a normal yearly income of around 5 million. Last year after the draws etc. between Dublin and Meath the income rose to around 6.75 million.

The current Donegal champions are Killybegs who boast the likes of Manus Boyle and Barry Cunningham. They lost the Ulster Final to Castleblayney . . . that match was here at Omagh.



### FERMANAGH PROFILES



DOMINIC CORRIGAN (30) - the Kinawley man was 'Man of the Match' in the Antrim game but he admitted that the team in general did not perform that well: "The result still went our way and we got the breaks that, maybe, in the past Fermanagh teams didn't get. The goal (which he scored) was a lucky one and came at the right time". He welcomed back the man who might have been in his place against Antrim, Garvan Gallagher, together with Raymond Curran and Raymond Moffett to squad training following injury: "The mood in the camp was so great that everyone welcomed them back as if they were not away at all. It was good to see those boys again and, perhaps, that pride in a Fermanagh



jersey was there in the past". Last year's defeat at the hands of Donegal, Dominic described as, 'a difficult experience'; however, the side had learned from that and he paid a special tribute (as a PE teacher himself) to the work of Benny Burns on the fitness end: "He has worked hard, set out a programme, stuck to it and the boys have great confidence in the programme and in Benny himself".

colin curran (25) - The captain of the side is one of five Lisnaskea Emmets players in the squad, the current 'double' champions in the county. He too welcomed back the injured and felt the squad, fitnesswise, was in as good a shape as they were for last year's 'semi'. "We have definitely learnt from last year. The way we let Donegal have their own way for those first 10 minutes and how we had to carry that the rest of the



game. In fact, that start we gave them was the difference between us in the end". Having made his senior debut for the county in 1983, one cannot but be impressed when he describes the present side as, 'as good as any team I have played in for a long time.' He too does little else - apart from the odd spot of golf - but eat, drink and sleep 'Donegal': It's in my mind all the time and that goes for all the players. Everybody is putting their heart into it and giving it a really good go. I definitely think we can take them this year."

### FERMANAGH PROFILES



PAUL COYLE (24) - There are traditionally strong ties between Paul's Club (Devenish) and Donegal, Garrison being so close to the Border and, in Paul's case, there's one especially strong tie: "I admire Martin McHugh. When I was growing up, around '83/'84, he was one of the best footballers in the county. Possibly the reason he appealed to me was he was left-footed. I tried to model myself on some players and he was one of them." GAA - apart from the odd meal out-occupies most of Paul's free time and he is the proud owner of a



scrap-book that logs his appearances on any team he has been involved in, from the Devenish U-14 team right up to the present. It certainly would be a nice statistic if he can record a Fermanagh semi-final win (even if it's against Martin McHugh's side). He says he is reasonably happy with his own form he played well against Antrim - but he also feels he can up that form and that 'it will take at least that to achieve a result on the day'.

PAUL BREWSTER (20) - After last year's defeat by Donegal, Paul was heard to say to a colleague, 'Don't be making excuses'. Reflecting on that game, he said it was a stepping-stone more than anything else': "We were busting to win but it was a day out, an experience. We were all very young last year and there were a lot of fellows who have benefitted from an extra year in College football. We're stronger, faster and fitter". And, as for the new management set-up, he



said quite simply: 'Brilliant'. And, what of Donegal? Here, the young Enniskillen man placed his cards on the table: "From what I know of them from last year and from what I've seen of them this year, they have six forwards who, on their day, would take any team apart and they have a half-back line who are very dangerous when they hit form. That means we have to close down their forward-line and stop their half-back line getting good supply. It should be our day".

## Ciaran Takes on The Champs

Fermanagh Minor team manager, Ciaran Carey (25) wants his squad to set their sights on realistic targets. Is beating Donegal-reigning Ulster champions-in this bracket?: "I would hope they are, anyway. It's a championship game and championship games are 50-50 affairs very often the same as it was against Antrim."

In their first round encounter against Antrim, Fermanagh struggled for their win but, in atrocious weather conditions, the forwards found scoring difficult: "We were relieved to get past Antrim," was how Ciaran summed it up.

As for Donegal, winners over Fermanagh last year, they will have the backbone of that side who were then exposed to the experience of winning an Ulster title. Fermanagh have some of last year's team, without that same level of experience.

And, into the bargain, Ciaran will have wrestled all week with his selection for today's game, given an injury list that includes Shane King and Neil Cox (who played against Antrim) and to Sean Monaghan and Dermot Smyth, players who would certainly have played but for more enduring injuries.

But, the other side of the coin is the attendance at training, especially by squad members who are exam-tied and who turned up on nights that Ciaran wanted to see them.

"In fact, because of exams, we have mainly concentrated our preparations at weekends. I would have to say the squad are all dead-on. They're a fairly level-headed group and, like most counties, it has been left to the players themselves to make their own arrangements to get to training.

"Some Clubs have been very good and will look after their own players but, in many cases, boys have no transport of their own and they're left to fend for themselves. There's no easy solution to that".

Anyhow, all those personal sacrifices will have been worth it should Fermanagh put away Donegal today. Their fans will be looking to a repeat performance from young fullback, Kevin Cassidy; for expert cover in defence from soccer star, Michael Farry and Cox (if he is fit); from a tried and tested midfield of Martin Greene and John Hanna - scorer of the goal against Antrim - and, finally, from a forward-line that includes the precious talents of Raymond Gallagher and, also, Shane King (if he is fit).

The occasion brings back fond memories to Ciaran of playing for Fermanagh Minors against Down (twice) in '83 and '84 - the latter of these in Newcastle where, in the end, there was just a couple of points between the teams (in Down's favour). On that Down team, Ciaran remembers Barry Breen and Neil Collins, two household names in GAA circles today. Will it be extra pressure on him, thinking he might have to turn out for the Seniors (Ciaran is a member of today's senior panel)? - "No. Not at all. The Minors are my first priority."
