Downings try to Bridge Five Year Gap

Downings return to MacCumhaill Park, Ballybofey, today - five years after they last lifted the Intermediate Championship trophy, their second success in this competition. They defeated Glenfin to win the title in 1981 and overcame St. Nauls in 1988 after a replay.

Nine members of the victorious '88 team will be on the park today, and no doubt they will want to taste success once again this year.

It's been a long, gruelling campaign for the Rosguill men, playing no less than eight matches to eventually guarantee their participation in today's final.

The team has a plethora of talent. Kevin 'Cookie' Gallagher and Paddy McTeague were both county minors last year and Gallagher won an Ulster minor medal with Donegal in 1991. Both lads also won Ulster Vocational School medals with Donegal in '92. Kevin Kelly is another player who has been a vital part of Pat Boyce's plan. Kelly, a wing back who can also feature at midfield, is also a former County U-21 player.

Yet, it's a Mayo man, playing at full forward, who has caused numerous opposition defences so many problems this year. David Burke, the Downings free scoring free-taker, who hails from Ballyhaunis has had an outstanding campaign, proving that he is a player of impeccable talent.

He is no stranger to the big occasion. In 1991 he lined out for his native 'Green and Red' in the All-Ireland Minor final at Croke Park. This year, his attributes have gained him a call up to the Donegal U-21 squad. A player certainly worth keeping an eye on today.

Unfortunately for them, Downings take to the field without talented minor star, Shane McClafferty, who is currently under suspension. The problems don't end there. Team captain, Kevin Kelly, may be forced to miss the final due to an untimely broken finger which he picked up recently.

In their run-in to today's game, Downings have disposed of St. Nauls in the first round, after a play-off. It took them a marathon four games to kill off the determined challenge of Naomh Mhuire in the quarter final and in a tight semifinal, they beat Naomh Ultan by 2-11 to 1-10.

As the old cliche goes, "on final day, anything can happen", but judging by the team spirit in the camp after their eight match run-in, taking into account the fact that they have knocked out the fancied Naomh Ultan from Division Two, Downings, currently table toppers of Division Three, look quite capable of lifting the crown this evening. It remains to be seen who will be given the task if Kevin Kelly doesn't play today, but I'm sure Kevin will manage, broken finger and all.


Na Rossa are contesting their third Intermediate Final in ten years. After winning the Junior Championship in 1982, they were promoted to Intermediate in 1983 and succeeded in getting to the Intermediate Final in their first year in that competition. In that final they met current Senior Semi-Finalists, Glenfin. After a ding-dong battle, the score stood at Na Rossa 2-7 to Glenfin's 1-10 with three minutes left. Then tragedy struck for Na Rossa. Glenfin were awarded a very dubious penalty. Current Glenfin full-forward, Francie Martin, stepped up to score the goal after goalkeeper, Pat Boyle, could only get his fingertips to the ball. From the kick-out, current Na Rossa centre-half back, Sean Bonner, soloed up the field and scored a point. This was to be the last score of the game, and so Na Rossa lost their first Intermediate Final on the score, 2-10 to 2-8.

It was to be six years before Na Rossa contested another Intermediate Final - that was in 1989. That year they met Naomh Ultan of Dunkineely in the Final. After a close contest all through, the game finally ended on the score Na Rossa 0-5 to Naomh Ultan 0-5. This was the fifth Intermediate final to end in a draw since the Intermediate Championship began in 1977.

The big question for the replay was whether the two county players, Martin Shovlin for Naomh Ultan and Declan Bonner for Na Rossa would dominate as much as they did in the drawn game. Indeed they did, and after another ding-dong battle, Na Rossa emerged winners on the scoreline 3-8 to 2-8. So, after winning their first Championship in 1982 - beating Gweedore in that year's Junior Final on the score 3-4 to 2-6, it took Na Rossa seven years to win their second - the Intermediate Championship of 1989.

Now in 1993 they are contesting their third intermediate final. The biggest handicap to Na Rossa in this final is the loss of two of their star players of the 1989 Championship winning side, namely Donal Bonner and Michael Bonner. Both were match-winning forwards in their own right and it is very sad that two players still in their 20's (Donal, 26 and Michael, 29) had to give up the game because of crippling knee injuries. Indeed if Na Rossa had these two players, it might be the Senior Championship Final they would be contesting instead of the Intermediate. Donal's knee injury was especially demoralising as he, no doubt had a brilliant senior Inter-County career ahead of him. Indeed it was argued when Donal and Declan Bonner were teenagers that Donal would be a brighter prospect than Declan for a glittering Senior Inter-County career. It was said that Donal was too young, when promoted to the Donegal Junior Team in 1985, when they reached the Ulster Final against Armagh and during that game, Donal, still only eighteen, received the fateful knee injury. Alas, fate must take its course and it was Declan who went on to have the glittering Senior Inter-County career, culminating in a Senior All-Ireland medal on that historic day, September 20th, 1992.






Cumann Peile na nDúnaibh

Bunaíodh Fo-Chumann na nDúnaibh i lafta "Diamond" sa bhliain 1938, agus foireann sóisear a bhí againn go dtí 1948, an chéad bhliain a bhain muid craobh péile na contae. Thit an fo-chumann as a chéile idir na blianta 1951-1954, le cibé pecleadóirí a bhí againn ag imirt d'fhoireann an Chraoislaigh.

Ath bhunáiodh an fo-chumann sa bhliain 1954 agus sa bhliain 1967 bhuil muid Lamh Dearg, Leitir Ceanainn i cgluiche ceannais na contae. Chónasc na Dúnaibh agus an Tearmann man fhoireann sinsear sna blianta 1963 agus 1964. Sa bhliain 1965 sinne muid an cleamhas a ba fhaide a mhair nuair a bhunaigh muid féin agus Leithinis Fhánaide ar an taobh eile de chaol na Maolruaidhe foireann Ghaeil na Maolruaidhe. Ni raibh de thoradh ar an cgleamhnas seo ach craobh sóiséar na Contae sa bhliain 1968.

For the present Downings team 1977 was when it all began. This was the year we decided to go it alone following periods of amalgamation with neighbours with Roger Casements from the Fanad/Milford area. That year ended with victory in the junior championship after a one point victory over Glenfin. We again encountered Glenfin in the 1981 Intermediate final and once again were victorious, winning 0-13 to 0-8. Hopefully we have stopped the "rot" with our senior team leading Division III and our junior side near the top in the Division IV. We also have a fantastic centre, a good pitch, a hard working committee and a healthy underage system, so, the future looks bright.
