


Fáilte Ón Uachtarán

PORTOBELLO LADIES GAELIC FOOTBALL CLUB U. S. TOUR 1993

t was Thursday, 22nd July, 1993, the scene was Dublin Airport. A mixed group of 21 people, all wearing green and navy tracksuits, made their farewells to families and friends, picked up their hand luggage and with barely concealed excitement, made their way to the boarding gate to begin the trip of a lifetime.

This was the Portobello Ladies Gaelic Club from Rathmines, Dublin creating a little bit of history as they set out on their U.S. Tour, the group consisting of 15 players, manager Jim Boyle and 5 supporters. Never before had a ladies football team from Ireland travelled to America to play the game and now Portobello, founded in 1986, were flying out to play against ladies teams in New York and Philadelphia.

The idea of a U. S. tour had first been mentioned, initially as a joke, back in January, 1992, but when, later that year, Portobello ladies won both Division One League and Championship titles, the players decided that the time was right - the U.S. tour was on!.

Many meetings were to follow in the months from September to June and financing the three week trip became top priority. It was hard work as no grants were available but the "craic" among the girls made the constant fund-raising seem almost enjoyable.

On arrival at Kennedy Airport we were welcomed by Terry Connaughton, President of New York Ladies Gaelic Football Board, who had organised transport to our hotel in Manhattan. The next few days were spent viewing the sights while the nights were spent with the Irish Community in The Bronx.

Our first game, against the New York All Star Selection, took place on Sunday. 25th July in Paddy's Field. There were moments of quiet pride for all of us when we stood there on the pitch while Amhrán na bhFhiann was sung, followed by the Star Spangled Banner. The game commenced, New York went into a 3 point lead before Bernie O'Connell, one of Portobello's founding members, scored our first point and we settled into the game. As the game continued it became evident that both teams were fairly evenly matched and considering that we found it difficult to play in the 90 degree heat, Portobello were not too unhappy to lose by one point 2-10 - 3-6. Post match celebrations continued with a meal and function in the nearby Lansdowne Beer Garden where each Portobello player was presented with a souvenir trophy and Grainne Gallagher iointly received the "Player Of The Match" award with Rose Dunegan, New York. Portobello in return, presented Terry Connaughton with a piece of Tipperary Crystal and each New York player with a Claddagh Ring.

Our next game, two days later, was against Cavan Gaels, winners of the New York Championship, again in Paddy's Field. This time, however, Portobello, in what was a very tough, physical game, were beaten by a larger margin than before. Both teams later met again and celebrated into the early hours at a reception

in "The Pinewood". Then it was off to Philadelphia in the evening where Tom Farrelly and the girls of Notre Dame Ladies Club made us feel very welcome. Days in Philadelphia were spent seeing the many historic sights, sunbathing by the nearby pool or buying Levis in Franklin Mills Shopping Mall. We even played a game of baseball! Social highlight was the "banquet style" function organised in honour of our visit. On Sunday afternoon we played Notre Dame, in 90 degree heat once more, with our supporters running onto the pitch to us during the game with cups of water to prevent dehydration. In a good competitive, but sporting game Portobello finished up winners with a score 4-5 to 1-8. A feature of the Notre Dame team is that some of its players were neither Irish nor Irish American but, nonetheless, have become skilful footballers who enjoy the game to the full. Both teams attended a post match function in the Irish Centre. Portobello and Notre Dame teams presented each other with rings and trophies while some of our players managed

to win large amounts of money in their weekly Lotto.

The next day Portobello flew to Orlando, Florida where we spent 4 days visiting Disney's Magic Kingdom, Epcot, MGM and Universal Studios, not to mention the water fun parks. Then it was off to St. Petersburg on the Gulf of Mexico to relax, enjoy the sun, sea and sand and even play some volleyball on the beach.

All too soon it was time to return home. We landed in Dublin on a lovely, sunny morning to be welcomed back by old friends, eager to hear our news. We will all treasure the memories of this trip, the friends we travelled with and the new friendships made in the U.S. We are proud of Portebello, the first Irish Ladies gaelic Club to tour the U.S. We are proud of ourselves for having successfully undertaken this trip and grateful to our friends and supporters who helped make it possible. We hope that this trip, and others like it, will promote the game here and abroad and look forward to having U.S. teams visit Portobello in the near future.

A Brief History -LONDON LADIES COUNTY BOARD

Ithough Ladies Football was played in London from the early eighties the first organised meeting took place on the 21st May, 1986 at the Irish Club, Eaton Square, London. In the first year three clubs affiliated to the Board, this has now grown steadily to twelve. Gaelic Games are rarely taught in schools in Britain so therefore responsibility is firmly placed upon volunteers to initiate and maintain clubs.

Since 1986 Ladies Gaelic Football in London has made great progress both at club and County level. Each year clubs compete in the league and championship. Since 1989 there has been an "A" and "B" championship, the idea of the "B" Champinship is to encourage and strengthen new or weak teams. In more recent years clubs compete in the All Britain Club Championship, in the All Ireland Club Championship and Inter Provincial competitions. Throughout the year there are many Irish Festivals and tournaments that clubs also take part in.

1988 was an important year for Ladies

football in London. The President of Cumann Peile Gael na mBan attended the Annual General Meeting, held in the Irish Cultural Club, Sailsbury Road. He spoke very highly of the developments of Ladies Football in London, and said that the way forward for London was to affiliate to the Association. In the same year London affiliated to Cumann Peile Gael na mBan and played their first intercounty game against Dublin in the G.A.A grounds at Ruislip, London. The developments of County Football in London has not only improved the standard of football in London but it has gained much respect and publicity. A high level of commitment and discipline is demanded from all players, but especially from county players who often travel 20 -30 miles to training three times a week, this may explain how London has been in the All Ireland final five times out of the last six years. Hard work and dedication from Board members has successfully promoted a positive image of Ladies Football at club and county level, thus attracting positive and enthusiastic new members.



History of Ladies Football in Donegal

Sunday, March 21st, 1992 was an historic day for the women of Dongal. The venue was Ballyshannon and the occasion was the first round of the National League. The women of Donegal were finally taking to the G.A.A. fields, beginning their inter-county careers, and hoping to follow in the successful footsteps of their male counterparts. And what a start! They beat last year's League semi-finalists Roscommon by 6—4 to 2—4.

When it comes to the G.A.A. the women of Donegal have always had a good record of involvement at club level throughout the county.

We are also proud to have, as county secretary, Noreen Doherty, who is the first and only female secretary of any County Board in Ireland. The day had to come when the ladies would need to be more involved than at administration level. So on November 30th, 1991, a meeting was called for all those in the county interested in starting ladies Gaelic football. The meeting took place in Jackson's Hotel, Ballybofey, and was attended by over seventy people from different clubs. A County Board was formed. The Chairperson elected was Aidan Doherty, husband of Noreen, the present Secretary of the G.A.A. Board.

First and foremost they wanted to make people aware and let them realise that another branch of the G.A.A. had emerged in Donegal. This was not an easy task. People were very ignorant at first at the idea of women playing Gaelic football. Some genuine G.A.A. supporters showed little support, while others were fully supportive. But thankfully in the last year, attitudes have changed as they see the high level of Gaelic skills displayed by the women. In February 1992, eighteen clubs affiliated to the County Board. Players

were registered and clubs got down to the task of training their players. Referee courses were held to make referees and players aware of the rule differences.

It was decided to run a League and Championship within the county and to confine inter-county involvement to underage level for 1992. St. Eunans pulled off the double, winning both the League and Championship, while Urris won the Shield final.

So what of the future? Donegal now have twenty one clubs playing ladies football.

The success of the Donegal men's senior team winning their first All-Ireland and reaching the '93 League final has an added affect on ladies football in the county and they felt the time had come for them to participate in adult competition at national level. Pat Walsh (Bundoran) was elected team manager — no stranger to football. He is also a referee. He has as his mentors Sean Gavigan (Naomh Columba), a former county player, as well as Paul O'Loughlin (Aodh Ruadh) and Kevin Barnes (St. Eunans).

The ladies have high hopes for the future of the game. They had a very successful League campaign but it has been their progress in the Junior Championship which has really caught the eye.

We would like all Donegal supporters to get behind this team in their quest for glory. To the doubters, I say, Ladies football is here to stay. It is not in competition with mens football but it does enhance the G.A.A. don't forget that ladies make up 25% of the attendances at all G.A.A. matches.

Many of the ladies come from strong footballing families. The pedigree is there, so let's see the support from all enlightened Irish men and women of the county.


Donegal Senior Team Success



KERRY - A Brief History

In 1974 Michael Fitzgerald took it upon himself to call a meeting at the GAA pavilion at Tralee, to find out how much interest there was in Ladies Football, within the county. A large crowd turned up for this meeting from a number of different areas in Kerry. On that night it was decided to form a Ladies Football County Board. About this time a Munster Council was formed when four Counties formed County Boards and about twelve teams were affiliated to a newly formed Central Council. Later on in 1974 Kerry won two games in the Munster Championship beating Waterford and Cork, but losing to Tipperary in the Munster Final at Tipperary. Michael and his team of mentors knew then that Kerry would need more experience and a greater panel of players if they were to make an impression in 1975.

In 1975 more teams affiliated to the Kerry Co. Board. In June Kerry played Waterford in the first round of the Munster Championship and won easily. They played Cork in the Munster semi-final at Castleisland and again won rather easily. In doing so they qualified for another crack at Tipperary in the Munster Final in Killarney. This was a game which Kerry

again lost. At this stage Kerry were wondering if they were ever going to beat Tipperary, but they had not long to wait.

The year 1976 was to be Kerry's greatest year in the short history of Ladies Football. They played Cork in the first round of the Munster championship at Banteer on the 10th of July, 1976 and won by 5-10 to 2-1. This was the most promising display by the Kerry girls to date. The next round was the Munster semi-final against Waterford at Fossa on July 23rd. Kerry won and surprised many male onlookers with their skills. And so for another clash with Tipperary. Kerry had a few injury problems that year but despite these setbacks, Kerry took on Tipperary on their doorstep and won the Munster Championship for the first time on a score of 3-1 to 0-3. Kerry travelled to Breffni Park, Cavan on the 11th Sept. to play Cavan in the All-Ireland Final for the very first time against Offaly. This was played at Lillteton, Co. Tipperary on the 10th October. The final score in the game was 4-6 to 1-5 and so the Kingdom had won the All-Ireland Title for the very first time.

Since then Kerry have gone on to win 9 All-Ireland titles in a row.

SNIPPETS



The incredible success of the INTO/GAA Mini-Sevens has given a major boost to the promotion of girls' football in Primary and Post-Primary Schools. This year 120 girls participated in the Croke Park exhibition games during the All-Ireland series. In excess of 5,000 took part in the county and regional stages of the event and, by all accounts, they thoroughly enjoyed the experience.

Primary school teacher Mary Jo Curran represents the parish of Beaufort on the Kerry Senior team today. During the Cork v. Mayo semi-final in August Marlene O'Sullivan from Kilgobnet N.S. in Beaufort displayed her skills during the half-time games. She remembers the occasion as "brilliant a day I will always remember. My mother, brothers, relatives and friends have replayed the video hundreds of times."

Marlene was accompanied to Croke Park by her father Jerome and brother John. Incredibly, for a Kerryman, Jerome was paying his first visit to Croke Park and he was greatly impressed by the way the family were looked after on the big day. Marlene pays tribute to school principal Pat O'Connor and team trainer Lil O'Sullivan, who led them to Mini-Sevens victory in Tralee and to participation in the non-competitive regional festival in Clare. Marlene now plays for Beaufort club and along with other Kilgobnet past pupils are lobbying for a ladies team in Killorglin Intermediate School where they now study. Austin Stacks star Eoin Moynihan, who leaches in Killorglin, will be under pressure to take up that particular challenge.

County Laois was also well represented

in this year's sevens. Mary Kirwan from Kilbricken, Portlaoise did the county proud with an excellent display. She began her football career in Shanahoe N.S. under the tutelage of David Brickley. They won the Berol Cup and entered the Mini-Sevens where their winning streak was continued. Mary was selected at the regional festival in Wexford. Her big day in Croke Park meant a lot to herself and the family.

She confessed to being "nervous at first but once I got going I was fine. The crowd was fantastic."

Ann and Martin Kirwan accompanied their daughter to headquarters and felt "very proud of Mary and extremely grateful for the way we were treated." Ann described the occasion as "a great family day out. The only complaint I would have is that the television coverage is too short. It shouldn't be too difficult to show a few minutes of the Mini-Games. It would be lovely for families to have it." Mary Kirwan has now joined Abbeyleix Under 14 team and hopes to wear the blue and white of Laois in Croke Park some day.

The importance of the Mini-Sevens for small schools and clubs was emphasised recently by GAA President Peter Quinn. Children from Peter's own Teemore Club in Co. Fermanagh, have participated in the Mini-Sevens and he describes the scheme as "a wonderful opportunity for boys and girls from smaller schools and clubs to realise the possibility of playing in Croke Park. It means a lot to a small club to have these children participating."

The Mini-Games format was originally suggested by Liam Ó Maolmhichil, him-

self a former Primary teacher, having seen children participate in similar fashion in Australia.

Liam regards the Mini-Sevens as having been "a great success and an ideal showpiece for the great work being done in our Primary schools." There is no doubt that the mini-game format has contributed greatly to the development of the skills of girls' football in recent years. It ensures much more ball contact which is vital for skill acquisition.

GAA Games Development Manager Pat Daly sees the Mini-Sevens scheme as playing a vital role in promoting the minigame concept. Apart from facilitating skill development through more ball contact, Pat maintains that "games are easier to organise and maximise participation and enjoyment."

1993 was a special year for the Mini-

Sevens as it coincided with 125th anniversary celebration of the INTO. General Secretary, Senator Joe O'Toole was delighted with the way things went — "It continues to be a great shop window for the work that is being done in Primary Schools to foster our national games. We are delighted to be joint sponsors of the scheme and it is particularly pleasing to see players coming through the system and appearing at club and county level. Sue Ramsbottom, who plays today, won the INTO/GAA skill award some years ago."

With the great work being done at schools' level and the Cumann na mBun Scol administered Mini-Sevens scheme to provide motivation and inspiration for our young players we can look forward to many more exciting ladies finals in the years ahead.
