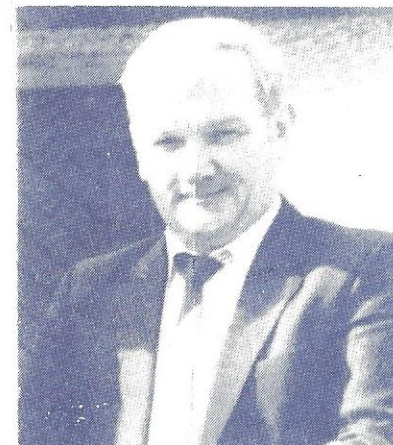

At that stage Kildare trailed the All-Ireland champion by one point -- 0-7 to 0-6 -- but as it transpired the Lilywhites failed to raise a flag thereafter.

The game was marred by the atrocious weather which saw continuous heavy rain almost throughout the first half.

Yesterday at Croke Park they beat Donegal by the minimum margin in a game that was always exciting but did have its scrappy moments and was regularly punctuated by what can only be termed the professional foul. Support for the Lilywhites completely outnumbered the following that came from the North-West to encourage the Ulster champions.

Kildare's victory can be attributed to those old fashioned virtues, hard work and refusal to accept defeat. There were times, particularly in the first half, when they looked on a hiding to nothing yet there was always somebody to inspire them with a timely interception in defence or a score at the other end.

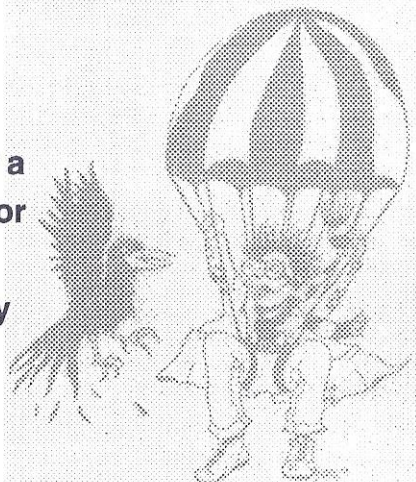

DONEGAL TRY OUT NEW BLOOD

Young Paul Callaghan from Burt is getting a run out this time, in the last game of this year, in keeping with team manager McEniff's promise to try out new players in this year's NFL. Also starting his first league game at senior level is Donal Breslin from Gweedore, son of another famous Donal Breslin who gave great service to the county in the mid '60s and '70s. Young Breslin played for the county at both under-21 and minor.

McEniff's promise to try new players has been made much easier, due to the fact that the injury list is so large, with J. J. Doherty, Barry McGowan, Tony Boyle, Manus Boyle, Barry Cunningham all out until after Christmas. Martin ("Rambo") Gavigan is going into hospital early next week for a knee operation and with luck he will be fit to resume the league in February. With Tony Boyle starting to respond to treatment, all be it very slowly, we would like to think we will be at nearly full strength for the new year.

**CAREW'S TWO GOALS NOT ENOUGH
TO SAVE KILDARE**

TOMMY CAREW, who was an outstanding dual-player in his day, grabbed a brace of goals in his county's National League final in 1968 but that did not prevent his team from going down to a smart-moving Down side by 2-14 to 2-11. Down got off to a blistering start before a crowd of 47,661 with 1-1 in two minutes, but Kildare were not in the least rattled, and after five minutes Jack Donnelly won possession and fisted a pass to Carew who sent a superb shot to the Down net. Within half a minute, Kildare were on equal terms from a Mullin's point.

The teams went on to provide some spectacular football and plenty of thrills in an exciting first half, which ended with Down ahead by 2-7 to 1-6. The Northerners had much the better of the exchanges after the restart, and gained what looked a comfortable 2-12 to 1-7 lead coming up to the 46th minute. Then in a six minute golden spell, Kildare, playing top-class football, scored 1-4, the goal a grand left footed drive from Carew, to leave only a point between the sides. It was the turn of Down to rally, and they did just that winning frees, two of which were converted by scoring wizard Paddy Doherty to clinch their last League title.

Carew, who lined out at left half forward, was understandably one of Kildare's best players. In a distinguished career in football and hurling, he won an All-Ireland under-21 football medal in 1965, and All-Ireland hurling medals in 1966 (junior) and 1969 (intermediate). Jack Donnelly, another link, with the 1965 under-21 title winning team, shared the scoring honours with Carew in that final with six points. Jimmy Cummins, Joe Doyle, Mick Carolan, who went in at centre-field at the start of the second half, and Kevin Kelly were others to impress for the All Whites.

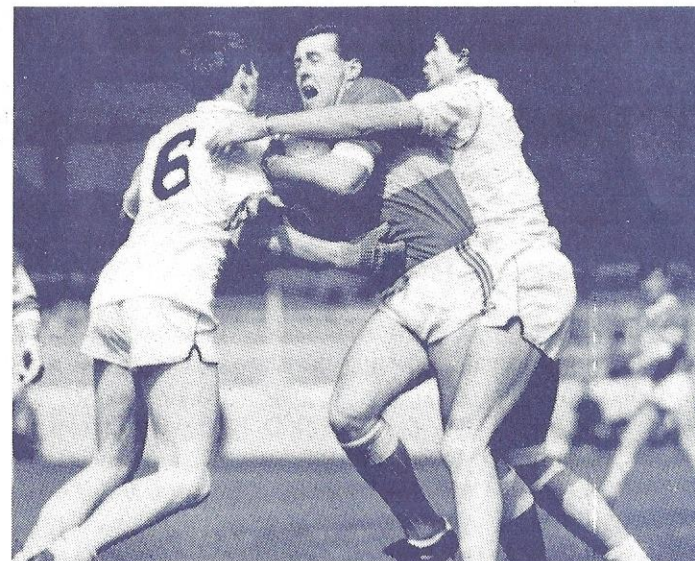

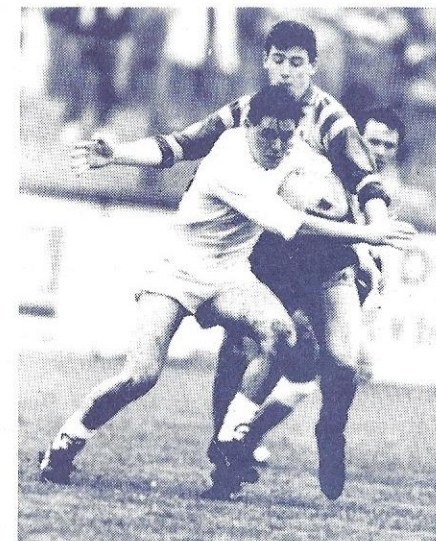

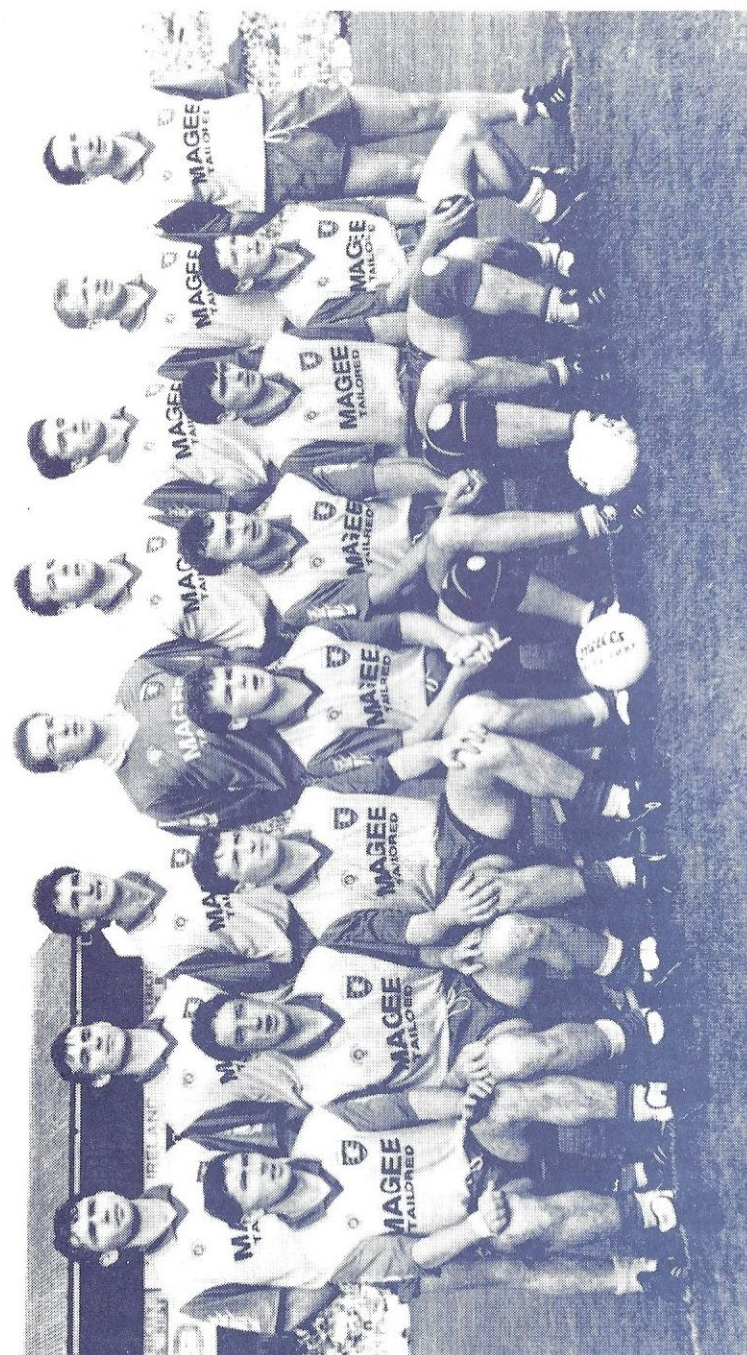
