KILDARE 2-11 KERRY 1-13

The Maestro and one of his most famous students met in a fascinating NFL Division 1 opener in Newbridge, which resulted in a one-point Lilywhites' victory and a cracking match packed with action and controversy.

A penalty goal for each side and the dismissal of Kerry wing-back Eamon Breen in the second-last minute were the most immediate talking points, with Kerry boss Páidí Ó Sé feeling his defender was most harshly treated by referee Paul McGann.

But the over-riding story was football maestro Mick O'Dwyer's successful return as Kildare manager after a two-year absence and the commendable quality of the game in absolutely atrocious weather conditions.

Derry topple poor Tyrone

DERRY0-7 TYRONE0-3

New manager Danny Ball was less than happy with Tyrone's poor performance against National League champions Derry at Celtic Park.

An inept and unimaginative Tyrone team lacked leadership throughout. They didn't score until the 47th minute of the game and at that stage a whitewash looked to be very much on the cards.

Anthony Tohill emerged as the game's outsanding figure. He kicked six of Derry's seven points from placed balls and, along with Henry Downey totally controlled midfield from start to finish.

Derry fielded only seven of their league final team, but the performances of relative newcomers Emmet McKeever, Ronan Rocks, Seán Lockart and Ronan McGuckin must have pleased their manager Brian Mullins.

To add to Tyrone's troubles, half-back Paul Donnelly was sent off in the 56th minute for a wild tackle on Séamus Downey, who had to retire injured.

Sheer persistence earned Cork the very least they deserved at Ballybofey, when Colin Corkery converted a free deep in injury-time to earn them a NFL division 1 point.

They did so in an attemp to protect a one-point lead, but were unable to do anything when Corkery stepped up from the angled 13-metre free to give the tiny number of visiting supporters something to cheer about on their long journey home.


