



#### DONEGAL - HALF A CENTURY AGO

Donegal made their exit from the first round of the Senior Championship, beaten 3-8 to 0-3 by Antrim at Letterkenny. The minors had slightly better luck, getting off to a good start with a 3-2 to 1-4 victory over Fermanagh at Irvinestown, but then lost to Tyrone, 3-5 to 1-1, in the semi-final at Dungannon. The Juniors also exited in the first round, losing to Derry by 4-3 to 1-1 at Derry. In the Dr. McKenna Cup, Donegal were also defeated by Derry 4-3 to 1-8, again at Derry.

Significantly, with the exception of the Senior Championship, all these were "away" games for Donegal. In the Dr. Lagan Cup they defeated Tyrone 4-2 to 3-4 at Dungannon; defeated Fermanagh 3-7 to 2-6 at Ballybofey, and drew with Tyrone, 3-3 each, at Omagh. This won Group 1A honours for them but they then lost the Final to Antrim by 2-4 to 1-3 at Lurgan.

1947 was really a year for their Junior hurlers, however, with wins over Antrim, 3-1 to 1-2, at Letterkenny, over Down in the semi-final at Lugan by 2-7 to 3-1, and victory in the Final against Armagh 6-2 to 2-3. There was disaster in the All-Ireland semi-final, however, when they were hammered 5-6 to nil by Dublin at Ballybofey.

#### **ANTRIM - HALF A CENTURY AGO**

As reigning Ulster champions, Antrim were expected to advance again in Ulster, and looked like doing this with wins over Donegal in the first round and over Down in the semi-final, but then defeat by Cavan in the Final on a dreadfully wet day. The minors went out to Down, 3-9 to 2-2, in the first round at Lurgan while the Juniors lost their opening game to Tyrone, 1-7 to 1-5 at Omagh.

In the Dr. McKenna Cup they defeated Down by 2-9 to 1-4 at Belfast but were surprisingly beaten by Armagh, 2-7 to 1-9, in the semi-final at Lurgan. Honours came their way, however, when they captured the Dr. Lagan Cup with wins over Monaghan, 2-7 to 1-4, at Clones, and over Armagh, 9-16 to 1-3 at Belfast. Down held them to a draw, 0-7 to 1-4 at Belfast, and in the Final they defeated Donegal by 2-4 to 1-3 at Lurgan.

They were much in demand for challenge games:- Antrim 3-5, Meath 2-8 at Navan; Cavan 2-10, Antrim 1-6 at Cavan; Antrim 5-7, Roscommon 0-9 at Croke Park; Antrim 4-11, Roscommon 0-7 at Irvinestown; Antrim 2-8, Louth 1-5 at Belfast; Antrim 8-10, Meath 3-5 at Belfast; Antrim 1-11, Mayo 1-11 at Ballina, and Antrim 2-6, Cavan 2-5 at Croke Park.

# Feile Peil na nOg comes to Donegal

The 27/28/29th of June next sees the arrival of the GAA festival of football for U-14 Boys and Girls in Donegal for the years 1997/98. The Feile which includes the county Champions from all counties as well as teams from Scotland, New York, Warwickshire, Lancashire and London will take place all over the county with each team from Donegal hosting a visiting team for the weekend. The boys competition will be run in five divisions based on standard of teams with the girls competition run in two divisions of 16 teams each. The main events of the weekend will be the opening parade on the Friday in Ballybofev where the 110 teams will show their colours to be greeted by Uachtaran CLG Joe McDonagh in McCumhaill Park. The teams will then be taken to their bases for the weekend

where they will play their host team. Saturday sees the main games taking place with each section of 4 teams playing each other to decide the teams for the semi finals. There is also a skills competition at each venue where one player from each team takes part, the winners to progress also.

Saturday evening the semi finals take place in each Division and on Sunday all the finals will take place in McCumhaill Park Ballybofey, commencing at 11am with the skills final and finishing at 4.30pm with the boys Division One final.

# Rules for the Puc Fada Competition

- 1. Each competitor will be allowed **three strokes** and they should be taken from the centre point on the 20 metre line.
- 2. The ball must be kept within the pitch area on both sides. Any ball going over the sideline will be considered a Puc but will not be marked.
- 3. If a competitor fails to strike the ball, this will be counted as a Puc.
- 4. The sliotar must be struck from out of the hand.
- 5. All competitors must be under 14 years on the 1st January 1997
- 6. The length of the Puc will be judged from the 20 metre line to where the sliotar dies.
- 7. All shots should be measured where there is a doubt.
- 8. Trophies will be provided for all winners at the various stages:
- County Provincial All-Ireland
- 9. The sliotar used in the competition must be a leather one

This time last year Donegal had just been crowned Ulster Minor League champions and had entered the provincial championship cloaked in optimism. In contrast, Antrim had sturggled in the League and were consigned to the role of also-rans in the championship.

Today, though, it's a rather different acenario. The Antrim Minor side showed steady improvement over the course ofthe recent League campaign and under the guidance of a management team that comprises Brian White, Brian Coyle, Roy McLarnon and Gregory Walsh the team have nosed into the frama as real contenders for the Ulster title.

Maybe that's a view that will be treated with sceptician in some quarters but Donegal will ignore Antrim's recent rehabilitation at their paril. Backboned by members of the Sean Stinsons club side that have won back to back Antrim titles, the Saffrona now boast a Minor outfit that is high on skill and ambition.

The fulcrum of the side is towering midfielder Adrian Dunlop who is reputedly one of the best young talents to emerge from the county for years. And given that their preparation has gone well and that they are acutely determined to build on their League prograss, Antrim are certainly capable of catching the eye.

Donegal's recent form has been disappointing, to say the least. Theteam never achieved any real fluency during the recent League and suffered several demoralising defeats, Manager John Joe O'Shea and his helpers have worked hard to groom the side but the setback endured last year when they were being touted as possible All Ireland champions appears to have lingered.

Nonetheless, it's a whole new ball game today and no matter what has taken place in the recent past in terms of League results, both teams will be out to prove a point. Donegal know that they must impress in their own back years while Antrim are aware that victory today would set them up for a seriosu tilt at the Ulster title.

It has the makings oa a cracking ite and the visitors might just find that Donegal are not just as short of under-age talent as some people would appear to think.


