

The 10th of January 1998 was to be a joyous occasion for everyone in the Naomh Chonaill Club, one of our players, Jim McGuinness, was to be named Player of the Year at the annual Donegal G.A.A. Banquet.

But it will be remembered with sorrow in Glenties. On that day Jamesie Breslin passed to his eternal reward. At the age of 45 he was called from this world to serve a higher master, and we in the Naomh Chonaill Club lost one of our hardest working members. Jamesie served as treasurer of the Club for a number of years and was an excellent fund-raiser up until his untimely death, his main function was always on the financial side, and he knew that to have



a successful Club you had to have a sound monetary policy.

He was one of the prime motivators of a very successful "Big Draw" during his term of office which enabled the Club to extend our dressing rooms, and was a diligent worker at our weekly "lotto".

Also as treasurer he was ever present at home games collecting at the gate, be it the "sunny days of summer or the cold and wet autumn evenings" Jamesie was always there to make a pound for his beloved Naomh Chonaill.

An ardent Donegal supporter, he travelled the country supporting the team and enjoyed the "crack". He had no enemies, only friends, and always no matter how big the crowd you always knew Jamesie was there with his distinctive laugh.


His death at an early age was indeed a severe blow to the Naomh Chonaill Club. A space has been left vacant that we will find difficult to fill.





Naomh Chonaill Na Gleanntai

Founded in 1921, the Naomh Chonaill Club has been in existence 77 years and is by far the longest established club or committee actively involved in the life of the community in the parish of Inniskeel.

Even before its foundation the first patron of Cumann Luthchleas Gael in Donegal was Bishop O'Donnell from Kilraine, later to become Cardinal, the first secretary was Alex McDyer, N.T., also from Kilraine, in fact the present chairman, Pat Connaghan, is also a Glenties man.

The Naomh Chonaill Club has served the County Board well down through the years with members holding all major positions.

The first Gaelic match played in Glenties was on Sunday 24th July, 1921, between Glenties (town) and Kilraine (selection), the winners being the town by one point. The game was played at the "Curragh", Mullinard.

Another interesting fact from the early days of the club was the appearance of the famous Kildare footballer Larry Stanley at a Sports Day in Glenties in 1925.

Stanley was captain of the Kildare team who won the All-Ireland final of 1919 and was a player on the Dublin senior team of 1923 which was also successful.

He was also a noted high jumper and represented Ireland in 1924 at the Olympics in Paris where he jumped 6 ft. He cleared the same height in Glenties on Sunday 6th September, 1925.

He played with Naomh Chonaill at the sports in a seven-a-side which the club won. The sports were held in Hollymount Park (Sproule's Field) which was a portion of the land

acquired by the club in 1963, and is presently the site of our G.A.A. pitch and is named the Davy Brennan Memorial Park.

Davy was a former club and county footballer and chairman of the Donegal County Board in 1962. He died in 1963.

Playing activity at the park is always at a very high level and we cater for all ages from under-10s to adult, primary schools, comprehensive schools, senior and under-age county fixtures.

Although quite successful on the playing fields, the Naomh Chonaill Club, since its foundation has produced players to equal the best and produced some excellent teams, but the Senior County Championship still eludes us, but we strive on and one day we will capture the coveted piece of silverware.


We must at this time not forget the first elected officers of Naomh Chonaill in 1921: Chairman Denis Phelan, secretary Packie Maguire, treasurer Tom O'Donohue, and all the officers, players and members who over the last 77 years have through the good times and bad kept the name of Naomh Chonaill G.A.A. Club to the forefront of our Gaelic games in Donegal.



Under team manager Hughie Molloy, Naomh Chonaill had high hopes for a good year in 1998. Though they welcomed back John and Gerard Gildea from the U.S.A. they lost players of the calibre of Hudie Campbell, Matthew Mannering, Stephen McKelvey. This weakened the balance of the team and they proved no match for Kilcar in the Championship. In the League they recorded good over Na Rossa, victories MacCumhaills, Aodh Ruadh and Dungloe and were just narrowly defeated by St. Eunan's, Killybegs and Naomh Columba. Young players to make their debut for the senior team this year were u-16 player Conal McKelvey, and minors Michael McLoone, Martin Molloy and Terence Campbell. 




KIERAN McGLYNN





A Sad Year For Naomh Chonaill

1998 has been a sad and tragic year for the Naomh Chonaill Club. We have lost some of our most hard-working and stalwart members. Death at any time is a major blow, not only to G.A.A. clubs but to family, relatives and friends.


In January the sudden death of Jamsie Breslin was a shock to the whole community. In April, a former player, Vincent Sweeney, departed this life.

Danny Boyle, our President, who served the Club all his life, was taken suddenly and without warning on the 5th July.

The tragic death of Mark McGuinness on the 3rd August in a car accident that touched the whole community and beyond.

DANNY BOYLE

The few words in this booklet would be very inadequate to detail the life of Danny Boyle in Cumann Luthchleas Gael. Danny played at all levels for Naomh Chonaill and represented the county with distinction. He was secretary of the club at the tender age of 21 and treasurer of the County Board for eight years. He held all positions in the South-West Divisional Board and all officerships in the Naomh Chonaill Club. A noted historian on G.A.A. affairs, his book "The Fields of Inniskeel", a history of Naomh Chonaill from its foundation in 1921 to 1965, was a compulsive read for all. He was instrumental in the purchase of our present grounds at Carrickbrack where the club has one of the best playing surfaces in the county. At the time of his death he was the President of Naomh Chonaill and is sadly missed.



MARK McGUINNESS

The tragic death of Mark McGuinness in August was once again to shock the whole community. He played at all levels for Naomh Chonaill and was admired by his fellow players. Known affectionately as "The Giant", he was tall in stature and an imposing figure on the field of play. Mark had a great love for underage football and enjoyed transporting the teams to the matches. He had a way with young people and they adored him. His death in a car accident was a tragic way to end such a young life.



VINCENT SWEENEY

A former Naomh Chonaill player who represented the club at county level in the 40s, Vincent Sweeney also passed away in 1998 after a short illness. A former goalkeeper with the club, Vincent also had a great knowledge of Cumann Luthchleas Gael and was a great supporter of the Donegal county team.






They brought honour to Naomh Chonaill

After a fine career at under age level the first glimpse of the talent of Jim McGuinness at senior level came when he played a prominent part in Naomh Chonaill's victory over Bundoran in the Intermediate final of 1990. He was soon drafted into Brian McEniff's Senior County Squad and was a member of the All-Ireland winning panel of 1992. Despite some stirring displays for his club Jim dropped out of the County scene and did not return until 1996. At the beginning of the 1997-98 league campaign Jim was installed at midfield and turned in some majestic displays including two man of the matches awards in the County's march to the League semi-final. He was picked to play for Ulster and emulated his friend and mentor Columba McDyer by becoming just the second Glenties man ever to win a Railway Cup Final. He also played a starring role for his college -

Tralee RTC in their victory in the presitigious Sigerson Cup competition. Jim was one of the stars of the county team that just failed narrowly to win this year's Ulster Championship. Jim has been a tower of strength for his club Naomh Chonaill and we wish him the very best as he is currently taking part in trials for Colm O'Rourke's international team to play Australia.



John Gildea

Even at a young age it was evident John had what it took to be a very good footballer. John played at all levels at under age for his club Naomh Chonaill. He also played at minor and under 21 level for Donegal. Due to work commitments and spells of emigration John had only played a handful of senior games for Donegal until this year. Back home from the U.S.A. last October he received a six month suspension for playing illegally in America. He continued to train with the county squad and as soon as the suspension ended he was immediately named in Declan Bonner's first fifteen for the league semi-final against Offaly. He has held his place ever since. His finest hour came against Cavan in the Ulster semi-

final. Donegal were a man down and under pressure. John was shifted to midfield and he became the architect of a fine victory for Donegal. Good news for club and county is that John has settled in Donegal and should be around the scene for many years to come.

Naomh Chonaill U-12 County Champions

History was made in the Naomh Chonaill club on 28th of June, 1997 in McDevitt Park, Fintra, when our U-12 team overcame a strong challenge from neighbours Ardara to capture the U-12 'A' (Div. 1) Co. championship for the first time ever. According to Co. Minor Board records the last underage championship title (proper) to come to the parish was Juvenile (U-16) in 1971.

Although numerous underage 'B' titles (u-12, U-13, U-14 and Minor) were won since 1988 this was the 'icing on the cake' for the club's underage structure and was due reward for those people who have done so much and given of their time so willingly in the administration, management and coaching of our youth since the formation of the club's Minor Board in the mid-eighties.

For the management team of Connie Doherty, Michael Quinn, Martin Doherty, Patrick Gill and all the players that Sunday in Fintra was the culmination of a four month campaign that started on the training pitch in Glenties on Tuesday March 3rd and continued unabated for a further 38 coaching/training sessions that saw the team go through the entire campaign undefeated.

The Divisional championship started with a surprisingly easy away victory in Ardara on Wednesday April 8th. Further wins for the team at home to Na Rossa, Naomh Columba, Kilcar and away to Dungloe, Naomh Mhuire and Killybegs, (the games v Killybegs and Naomh Mhuire the toughest) ensured a divisional final spot, the opponents, Ardara, the venue Fintra. Although Naomh Chonaill started shakily they soon settled to their task and had a fairly convincing victory 5-12 to 2-8. Captain, Donal Cape accepted the cup on behalf of the team.

The Co. quarter-final was against Four Masters. Played in Ardara the Glenties lads won with relative ease. The Co. semi-final against the hotly tipped Aodh Ruadh, Ballyshannon saw the 'mother of all battles' in Fintra. This match was nip and tuck throughout and in the end, a one point winning margin was just about deserved in a game that really saw the Naomh Chonaill youngsters come of age, with a gutsy, never say die attitude that saw them through.

Ardara had beaten Malin in the other semi-final and the stage was set for an all S.W.

County final against the 'auld enemy' the venue, once again Fintra. Naomh Chonaill had beaten Ardara in their two previous encounters but the Glenties mentors knew that this counted for nothing and that Ardara, under John McConnell and Anthony Molloy were steadily improving.

This game had it all – ten goals, 21 points and two teams who played outstanding football in front of what must have been the largest ever attendance at an U-12 final staged on its own.

During the first half there were anxious looks on the Glenties management as the advantage of the breeze was not yielding the scores and going into the interval it looked like it was going to be Ardara's evening as Naomh Chonaill never seemed to get out of low gear. Half time score: Naomh Chonaill 0-10, Ardara 2-4.

However, all this changed at the break when bainisteoir, Connie Doherty gave a passionate, rip-roaring speech about effort and commitment and it certainly uplifted 15 players in blue and within three and a half minutes of the restart midfielder, Conal McNelis had cracked in three outstanding goals. Ardara, although they rallied hard, after that shell-shock they could not catch up and Naomh Chonaill went on to record a memorable victory.

The cup was presented to captain, Conal McNelis by Co. Minor Board chairman, John Friel. Such was the crowd on the field at this juncture, one could have been forgiven for thinking it was the senior championship final

Once again, well done and congratulations to all concerned!




Our heroes are but a small section of the people who by their work have ensured that the G.A.A. remains strong and virile.


