




April 22nd and what it meant...

Anyone who ever dares utter the words 'sure its only the League' ought to be reminded of that fateful April Sunday when our battle scarred troops made the walk that so many before them have only dreamt - climbing that sacred monument of our National Games, the Hogan Stand.

While our summer petered out into destruction after our success in April, 2007 was still a year to remember as we collected our first National title since 1992 and only our second ever National trophy.

For those of us who were not old enough to enjoy properly that Autumn Sunday in '92 when Manus Boyle hit nine points as Brian McEniff's men put those pesky Dubs to the sword, this year's triumph was special.



I was only five years old when Sam came to the Hills. Didn't really understand the meaning of it all. I knew that Anthony Molloy was bringing Sam home, that we had some wee man from Kilcar who could play a bit and yer man Boyle from Killybegs could stick the ball over the bar. As an impressionable little senior infant, Margo O'Donnell's deluct tones helped in explaining it all. While just a mere couple of feet tall I, like the rest of the County, was 'Walking Tall.'

Unable to form much of a tactical analysis, I could still proclaim that Matt Gallagher had ran around Mayo talisman Liam McHale 'like a small boat in a gael'

and that Sam would go down as being 'Donegal's best catch.'

After Manus hit those nine historic points and Charlie Redmond failed to beat Gary Walsh with his big kick, Donegal rejoiced for weeks on end as the triumphant heroes toured the county.

We thought at the time that we would experience these joyous days on an annual basis. We got carried away. We had a right to. We were kings...

Fifteen years is a long time. A lot of water has passed under the bridge since then and a dozen finals had been played and lost since '92. Great gaels had passed on and other had emerged. Donegal were going into battle on final day once again as Mayo stood in the way of another title.

When I came into this game just 18months previously as a wee cub reporter I dreamt that one day I may be writing about a great Tir Chonaill day at headquarters. The first summer following the county from the press boxes, two defeats were suffered - Ulster Final and All Ireland Quarter final of 2006.

But, one sensed that April 22nd was to be our day. We got off to the best possible start, but as . we entered a nerve-rattling eight minutes of stoppage time - added on following an injury to Ciaran Bonner - the sides were level at ten points apiece. Then, Donegal said that it was time for silverware. Super subs Rory Kavanagh, Eamon McGee and Adrian Sweeney put over the points that saw us take a 0-13 to 0-10 win. John Bannon's concluding whistle was greeted with a roar of relief that has rarely been heard around the Jones' Road. Croker had never seen celebrations of such a

nature so early in the year.

We pressmen are supposed to be neutral. But, as those three late scores went over, it was hard not to leap from the perch in delight. Once again we were 'walking tall' and neutrality was cast to one side for an evening.

Battle-scarred Neil Gallagher climbed the Hogan steps to collect the prize and a county united in celebtration as the Glenswilly man hoisted the trophy high into the capital's sky.

The Hills of Donegal played as the Tir Chonaill faithful partied like it was September



with the only disappointment being that Eamon McGee didn't take up his skipper's offer to 'sing a wee song!'

Just after 11.00pm, led by the Ardaghy Pipe Band, the team bus carrying the Donegal team rolled into Donegal Town with an extra passenger on board. It was the National Football League trophy's maiden voyage into the county and the hosts were determined to make it feel welcome.

A decade and a half after Anthony Molloy brought the All Ireland back to the Hills, one could have been forgiven for thinking it was the autumn as the green and gold hoards partied jubilantly in the land of the Four Masters.

'Only a League title' it may well have been. It was ours though and there is only ever one first time. May as well make the most of it. Alas the win didn't provide the platform for the summer months, but we'll be back again and who knows we could well be rejoicing in September before too long...


