Understrength Kilcar lose out to Magheracloone in Ulster

Understrength Kilcar made a brave bid for a place in the Ulster Minor Club semifinal before finally going down to Monaghan champions Magheracloone, in Saturday's quarter-final in Antrim.

Without county seniors Ryan and Eoin McHugh, and Stephen McBrearty, and injured county U-21 player Conor Doherty, the Donegal champions were still in this tie right up to the closing minutes.

The sides were level at 0-7 each with eight minutes remaining before the Monaghan men produced a late flourish to hit four points.

The game, up to those closing minutes, was keenly contested with Magheraclone two up at half-time as they led 0-5 to 0-3. Kilcar's Aodhan McGinley had an 11th minute penalty saved, after Chris Doogan had been fouled.


Alan McCahev scored

four of Magheracloone's first half points, with three of them from frees. Paudie McMahon scored their other on the stroke of half-time to give then the two point cushion. Matthew McClean, from a free, and his brother Andrew, with two super points, were the first half Kilcar men on target.

Andrew McClean landed Kilcar's first point of the second half either side of strikes from McCahey and Jonathon Coleman before Aodhan McGinley kicked three without reply, two of them frees, to tie up the game on 49 minutes.

But in the closing minutes Magheracloone finished with points from James Lambe, McCahey (2) and Daniel Hand to finish with four to spare and a somewhat flattering winning margin. Indeed Cormac Cannon had a goal chance for Kilcar which would have put them back in the lead in that vital final period.

Aodhan McGinley picked up the man-of-the-match

"They stood up to the task and they were level with eight minutes to go," said the Kilcar boss.

"It was disappointing that the team and the club were not given a fair chance to put their best foot forward in the competition," said McNulty, who felt that they would surely have qualified for the semi-final of the competition if they had all their players available.
