THE STORY SO FAR

With provincial honours retained for the Senior Hurling and Camogie sides, Slaughtneil are two steps away from matching their remarkable feat of 12 months ago.

However, those final two steps could prove to be the toughest of all. Having overcome Omagh and Kilcoo so far, Slaughtneil have accounted for the two sides they defeated in the provincial finals of 2014 and 2016 respectively. Now they take a step into the unknown against the Donegal champions.

Having bridged a 24-year gap to claim their sixth county title, Kilcar exploded onto the Ulster scene when they blitzed Scotstown to record a 10-point victory. While their victory may not have been a surprise, the manner of it certainly was, a far cry from the drab performance they had displayed in their county final two weeks previous. This encounter, under the lights in Healy Park, promises to be a cracker.

The other semi-final sees two sides familiar with the Ulster Club Championship reach somewhat unchartered territory of late. While Cavan Gaels are no strangers to the provincial scene, their victory over Lámh Dhearg was a first win in the four attempts, since they defeated another Antrim side St Gall's back in 2008.

They face Derrygonnelly, who fresh from completing three-in-a-row in Fermanagh, also secured their first provincial victory when they saw off Armagh Harps. Both sides will see this as an excellent opportunity to reach the final, and in doing so will end a long wait for representatives from either county in the decider. It has been 2002 since a Fermanagh side was there; 1995 for Cavan.


With Slaughtneil seen by many as the team to beat in the Senior competition, another Derry side have been showing promising form at Intermediate level. Newbridge have overcome Shercock (Cavan) and Belcoo (Fermanagh) thus far, but in doing so have kicked 2-20 and 3-16 respectively. If they can carry on that scoring threat, they will be formidable opponents for any side.

Next up is Moy, the Tyrone champions seeing off Carrickmacross in the last round in a low scoring encounter. Donegal's Milford will return to the Athletic Grounds this weekend. two weeks after their narrow triumph over Killeavy at the same venue. They'll need to draw on that experience when they face a resurgent Rostrevor side who easily dispatched of St Brigid's in their previous game. The race for the Junior title remains wide open, with all four teams harbouring hopes of claiming the silverware.

Tyrone winners Tattyreagh impressed in their victory over Currin of Monaghan, and with the club marking its centenary year, they'll be keen to build on that performance and reach the decider. To get there, they will have to overcome Donegal side Naomh Colmcille who saw off the determined challenge of Ballymachugh (Cavan) in the last round.

Doire Trasna had a goal rush to thank for seeing them home against Ballyhegan. The Derry men found the net four times in an impressive team display which will fill them full of confidence for this weekend. They face Belnaleck, the Fermanagh men overcoming Down side Dundrum to reach the last four.

ANTI-BULLYING WEEK 2017



Ulster GAA in conjunction with The Northern Ireland Anti-Bullying Forum (NIABF) and the Child Protection in Sport Unit (CPSU), are calling on all units of the Association to take part in Anti-Bullying Week between 13th and 17th November 2017.

This year's theme for the campaign is "All Different, All Equal" which looks at how we can help children and young people celebrate what makes them, and others, unique and help them understand why it's important that every child feels included in sport and is able to be themselves without fear of bullying.

The GAA Tackling Bullying Programme is a resource developed by the GAA to provide assistance to members to help them deal with incidents of Bullying. The two-hour training workshop is suitable for Coaches, Parents, committee members and other Club personnel and also includes a range of publicity materials for Clubs. The workshop aims to equip participants with tools and skills that will enable them to identify, prevent and resolve incidents of Bullying that may occur in their clubs.

Bullying is an issue that causes many problems within our clubs and communities, and we encourage all clubs to consider these top 5 tips:

- Support the campaign by displaying the promotional materials and attending the workshop.
- 2. Formally adopt the Anti Bullying Policy at Club Executive level & inform members.
- 3. Create a culture within the club where children and young people are encouraged to raise concerns and tell a trusted adult if they are on the receiving end of this type of behavior or have witnessed it happening to others in the club.
- First response by coaches/mentors when they see this type of behaviour happening is vital.
- Adopt a zero tolerance approach to this type of behaviour where it is regarded as a serious breach of the Code of Behaviour and shall be dealt with accordingly.

Cyber Bullying

This is bullying behaviour that takes place via mobile phone or through the internet via email/instant messaging/social networking sites/Texts/messages or images that are sent or posted on sites, which hurt, intimidate or embarrass another person. Cyber Bullying is no different from any other forms of bullying in that the behaviour is the same and the impact no less devastating, and therefore incidents of cyber bullying should be treated as though they happened in real time. If you are aware of someone being cyberbullied, please consider the following:

- Listen and learn about what has been going on, for how long, where it has been taking place and what exactly has been happening. If you are not their parent/ guardian ensure you make them aware of the situation.
- Suggest that they do not open messages from the addresses/numbers but allow you/parent/guardian to open them instead.
- Consider changing their mobile number and restrict access to the number.
- Changing online profile log in and passwords, and using the 'reporting' feature that is available on most social media sites asking for offending messages and photos to be removed. Ensure that online profiles are made private and only shared with friends. Restrict what can be posted to your profile until after you have given permission.
- Involve other agencies if necessary, including PSNI/Childline or NSPCC.
- Support the young person, your initial reaction is vital – Listen, Learn, Involve and Resolve.

Our Games

Our Code, the Code of Best Practice in Youth Sport for the GAA includes the Anti- Bullying Policy, which aims to adopt a whole organisational approach to addressing bullying and provides advice and support to clubs in the area of Safeguarding. We remind all clubs to implement the Code of Behaviour with all relevant personnel in your club including players/coaches/committee members/ parents/referees and supporters at the start of each season. It is also appropriate at this time of year to remind you to make sure that all those working with children and young people in your club have been appropriately trained and adequately vetted prior to commencing work in the club.


