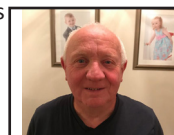
hurlers and I wish both teams every success today.

James Callaghan - Junior Final

James is a dual player and dual referee operating out of the Setanta and Red Hughs clubs. He has had the honour of representing Donegal in both underage and senior hurling teams.

James won an u-16 football championship with Red Hughs and as a hurler with Setanta he has a minor championship medal, four senior hurling championship medals and an Ulster championship. He has also won two All-Ireland championship medals while playing with Kilmacud Crokes. James managed the Setanta club to u-14 and Feile county titles and was also referee in last year's Junior Hurling final His favourite Gaelic footballer is Armagh's Kieran McGeeney, while the legendary Ken McGrath of Waterford is his favourite hurler. He likes to let the game flow, his favourite quote being "play the whistle lads".



Aidan McAleer - Senior Final

The referee for the Senior final between Setanta and St Eunans is Aidan McAleer. Aidan's Club is Naomh Pádraig Uisce Chaoin, Magh and he started his referee-ing career in 2015. He joined the Ulster Referee Academy in 2017, graduating in 2019 and was also called onto the National Support Panel in 2019.

Aidan made his senior inter-county debut in January 2020 when he was the man in the middle for Tyrone versus Louth in the National League.

Aidan is married to Teresa and has three children. He is looking forward to a competitive final today between Setanta and Naomh Ádhamháin. He would like to thank his umpires -Jonathan and Neil Toye, Brian Kelly and Ray Lannon - the standby referee Trevor Maloney and linesman Michael Connolly.



Ground Regulations

01. All persons entering this ground are admitted only subject to the following Ground Regulations and to the Rules and regulations of Cumann Luthchleas Gael. Entry to the ground shall be deemed to constitute unqualified acceptance of all these Rules and Regulations.

Fireworks, smoke canisters, gas- horns, bottles, glasses, cans, flags, banners, poles and other similar articles or containers, including anything which could or might be used as a weapon, are not permitted within the ground and any person in found to be in possession of such an article or container may be refused entry or ejected from the ground
03. The consumption of alcohol is not permitted within the ground and spectators are not permitted to bring alcohol into the ground.
04. The unauthorized climbing of any structure, walls or buildings in this ground strictly forbidden.
- 05 Unnecessary noise from the use of radio sets, gas-horns and behaviour likely to cause confusion Of nuisance of any kind, including foul or abusive language, is not permitted in any part of the ground.
06. Under no circumstances is it permitted to throw any object the pitch.
07. Unauthorised persons are not permitted to enter upon the field of play.
08. Any person who fails to comply with the instruction from a Garda or Steward may be ejected from the ground.
09. In general, the right of admission is reserved to the Ground Management.
10. The Ground Management reserves the right to refuse admission to or eject any person who refuses to be searched by a member of the Garda Síochána.
11. Any person who remains in or obstructs a gangway or circulation area may be ejected from the ground.
12. The Ground Management reserve the right for it's servants or agents to remove from the ground any person who does not comply with the Ground Regulations or whose presence in the ground could reasonably be construed as constituting a source of danger, nuisance or annoyance to other spectators.
13. All persons in the grounds are reminded of their obligation under Section 18(3) of the Fire Services Act 1981 to ensure that their behaviour does not present a danger from fire to anyone using the grounds.

Trophy Presentation Guidelines

Covid Guidelines advise the physical handing over of cups be avoided. Instead the winning captain trophy should lift the trophy directly rather than it being presented to him. Trophies should remain in the presentation area once the captain has completed his speech.

Special attention will be be paid to facilitating speeches. The sharing of microphones will be avoided; with two people speaking there will be two microphones available to avoid their sharing.

County Boards were advised to retain trophies until a later date after the presentation is completed but CLG Dhún na nGall have decided to allow the winning team to retain Corn Ó'Maólaín and Corn na Mumha. It is expected, however, that the clubs will be sensitive to Covid guidelines in the use, and sharing, of the trophy.

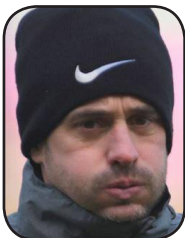

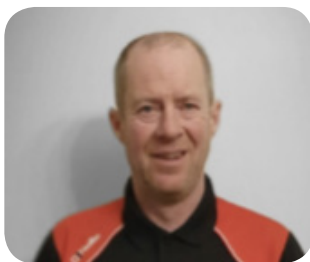

Burt win six in a row on home ground *(by Damien Dowds)*

Burt 1-16 Naomh Mura 1-6

The Donegal Senior Hurling championship final was played, for the first and so far only time, at Hibernian Park in September 1996 and pitted Burt against Naomh Mura.

It was the fifth final between the parish rivals in just six years, but the close match which had been anticipated didn't materialise.

The ageless John O'Brien lined out in goals in what proved to be his last county final appearance, while Paddy Flood, now of St Eunan's, won his fourth SHC medal in the Burt colours.

Despite being without their talismanic centre half back Darren McDermott, who earlier in the year had played for Ulster in the Railway Cup semi-final against Munster in Ennis, Burt had things mostly their own way.

Team captain Andrew Wallace was unerringly accurate from frees and Burt built up an 0-11 to 0-2 lead by half time.

Naomh Mura threatened to make a game of it when Donal Walker (who, incidentally, is the current Burt chairman)

hit the net and reduced the deficit to four points early in the second half.

Wallace hit four unanswered points, and Ray Durack sealed the win – and a sixth championship in a row – for Burt with a goal 12 minutes before the end.

Naomh Mura did gain a measure of revenge when they won the county hurling league final a fortnight later.

In what was typical of the times, the county final had been played after the Ulster club championship.

Burt were nominated as Donegal's representatives, and in a game played six weeks before the county final, lost to Dungannon by 4-15 to 3-7.

The team, drawn exclusively from Burt and Naomh Mura, was the first from the county to win a National Hurling League title. Under the management of Darren McDermott, PJ O'Brien and John O'Brien, Donegal had victories over Tyrone, Monaghan, Longford, Mayo and Sligo for an unbeaten season in Division 4 of the National Hurling League.

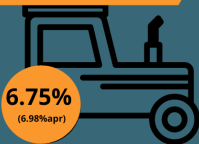

The black and amber jerseys have had great success over the years in Gaelic football, hurling, ladies football and camogie, winning senior championships in all codes. We have been Donegal senior football champions on 16 occasions (most recently 2014), senior hurling champions 8 times (1972), ladies football winners 13 times (2005, along with 4 Ulster titles between 1993 and 1998) and camogie champions 8 times (2000). Our club has had All Ireland football winners with Donegal in 1992 (Paul Carr, Charlie Mulgrew and Mark Crossan) and 2012 (Rory Kavanagh and Kevin Rafferty). Our underage teams have performed strongly in recent years winning numerous championships and leagues all codes.

After an absence of almost two decades hurling was restarted in St. Eunan's in the 1990's. We won the Donegal junior championship in 2000 and intermediate championship in 2001. The following year we made our most first appearance in the senior hurling championship final since 1972, losing out to the great Burt team of that era. In this decade new young players from our juvenile teams have combined with our veterans to bring us to a new level. The main focus

has been on juvenile development, with many years of hard work by dedicated coaches leading to county victories at various levels. Our teams are backboned by many duai players, a trend that can be seen in recent years in the most successful clubs nationwide. Our underage hurling successes have brought us the point where we are consistently challenging for the Donegal senior hurling championship. 2020 will be our third senior final in four years. Our camogie coaches are continuing to develop their young players.

We are strongly represented on all county teams and our fine pitch at O'Donnell Park hosts many intercounty matches. Most home games for Donegal hurling teams and many hurling and camogie championship finals are now played in Letterkenny. St. Eunan's players play major roles on our county's teams at all ages. It was a proud moment for us this year when Seán McVeigh captained Donegal to our Allianz National Hurling League Division 3A win, with many club colleagues by his side. Our young club players have been to the forefront of Donegal hurling teams playing in top level competitions lately. We look forward to contributing further to Donegal playing hurling at a high level.

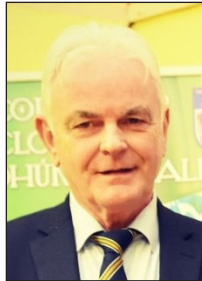


Iománaíocht - an sport is sine sa tír - forbhreathnú gairid ar Dhún na nGall *(Fergus MacAoidh, CLG Dhún na nGall)*

B'iad Beart a bhain an chead craobh contae san iománaíocht anseo i nDún na nGall sa bhliain 1905. Sa bhliain 1906, bhain an contae a chead corn mhór - craobhchomórtais Iomána Sinsearach Uladh nuair a bhuail Dún na nGall Aontroma sa chluiche ceannais. Ba é seo an bhliain cheanna a bhain foireann d'ainm Sinn Féin Bun Dobhráin craobh na contae. Tá sé suimiúil gur bhain Dún na nGall craobh sinsear Uladh san iománaíocht ar thrí ócáid ins na blianta 1906, 1923 agus 1932.

Bhain Dún na nGall Corn Lory Meagher sa bhliain 2011. Ba é Dún na nGall an chead chontae a bhain Corn Nicolas Mhic Riocáird (Nickey Rackard) ar thrí ócáid i 2013, 2018 agus 2020. Chuidigh seo go mór le athbheocháin iománaíochta sa chontae. Bhí i gcónaí agus tá go foill daoine in achán cluba d'obair chomh dian dícheallach chun an spórt a choinneal beo. Tá buíochas agus creidmheas mór tuillte ag na daoine sin a d'fhan leis nuair nach raibh an spórt a imirt chomh forleathan agus atá anois.

Bhí suim i gcónaí san iománaíocht i nDún na nGall agus thar na blianta bhí cuid mhór clubanna a d'imir an chluiche Gaelach is sinne sa tír. Mar is eol dúinn, is é an pheil Ghaelach an príomhsport i nDún na nGall agus thar na blianta mar thoradh air seo bhí níos lú daoine óga ag roghnú iománaíocht a imirt. San am i láthair, tá athbheochan insan iománaíocht le clubanna ag imirt sa Chraobh Sinsearach agus Sóisearach. Tá an dá chlub seo i bhfad chun tosaigh ar na clubanna eile ó thaobh an méid atá bainte acu ach tá feabhas ag teacht ar na forine eile sa chontae

atá le feiceál bliain indiaidh bliain. Is iad Setanta rogha na gcoitiantacha sa chluiche ceannais sinsear inniú agus cé nar bhain Naomh Adhamhnáin sa chraobh soiséar ó 2000 agus sinsear ó'n bhliain 1972 tá feabhas le feiceál orthú achán bhliain. Is é seo an tríú bliain indiaidh a chéile dóibh theacht aníos in éidean Setanta sa chluiche ceannais. Is cinnte go mbeidh cluiche de ard chaighdeán againn inniú agus tá sé deacair a rá cé acu de na forine a bhéas mar sheampainí ag deireadh an lae.
